



FROM THE K-6 PRINCIPAL

There were two events last week that really spoke to me. The first was an art show of the kindergarteners in Amy Koskowski's and Kristen Edwards' Pod. All year Amy and Kristen have been using their project to teach the kindergarteners about artists and art. The children study an artist and then they make a work inspired by that artist. The students have made work that interprets many artists' work such as Vincent van Gogh, Henri Matisse, Georgia O'Keeffe, and Jackson Pollock. Amy tells me that when the year began it was a task for the children to fill the page with marks but as the year progressed they could do more and more. Amy and Kristen have been collecting the work the students have made. They then assembled each kindergartener's work on four by six foot pieces of black paper and hung each artist's work in its own space. There was no confusion of who had made what and instead of a label with the child's name there was a picture of the child. The work that Amy and Kristen have done this year is a feat of organizational and creative skill that is as fine an example of what can be done in Project as any I have ever seen.

Here is what I first wrote Amy upon seeing the work hung in the school:

Hi Amy,

The student artwork is beautiful. It is wonderful to see the influence of the adult artist that your students have copied and their own individual hands and hearts. I also love the timelessness of their work. There is not the striving to become but an embrace of who they are. There is always that duality in an artist's work, the space between the work and the work as a product of the moment.

On last Wednesday, at the opening for the show, all of Amy's and Kristen's students also had up their exhibitions of mastery. In these exhibitions of mastery each student studied an artist. I loved seeing these artists, whom I had studied in school and whose work I knew from museums, through the eyes of these children. A test of the impact of art is if it can transcend the context in which it was made. This student work was made in the context of study but you did not need to be involved in that context to know that this group had achieved something big. It was right there on each child's panel. It was in large part by how the show was curated that allowed us to see the children's work. Each child was given their own space so it was not about Claude Monet it was about Ryder, or Eileen, or Ellie. To see the body of each child's work and then to look at their picture helped you see their hand and their heart. What is exciting about the students work is that it is not primarily Matisse, Pollock, Van Gogh, and O'Keeffe but it is the work of that child at that moment. The show has a kind of presence that makes you say, "Oh yeah that is Adrian. This is who he is."

The work transformed the school and the show will be up through this week so please come in and see it. See just how hard the children work and just how much the teachers care.

Last Friday on Level I it was a graduate of the school, Thamanai Jeremie, who stole the show. Thamanai, or Tammy as I knew her, was one of our first students from Randolph. Her family would get her all the way from Randolph to Hull and back again every day for four years. Transportation became much simpler when the school moved to Norwell and Tammy graduated from SSCPS in 2007. We had Tammy back because she had not only become a teacher, she is an author. She was at Level I All Pod to read her book, Kindergarten with Charlie. When she arrived, Wardie, who had come in on a Friday to see her former student, was leading the K – 2 students in singing and one of the songs was one Tammy had taught Wardie sixteen years before, "Peace Like a River." Tammy sat right down next to Wardie and took control of the crowd of K - 2 students. To say that it was mesmerizing is to minimize how wonderful it was to see Tammy again, and to see what a star she has become. It felt like we had come full circle.

Tammy read her book as John Coltrane played "Love Supreme" in the background. After the book was complete Tammy talked about how to be and how to live. I know I was proud of who she had become and honored that she gave SSCPS part of the credit. Here is some of what Tammy wrote to us about the school and her career:

My family! That is who you are. Part of my story. Part of my roots. We share humanity and the globe with each other. You wanted me to excel. At times I did fall but positivity, art, and resilience are all the things that you have instilled in me. For that I am eternally grateful.

The Level I teachers said it was the most attentive and best behaved group of students we have had all year. The kids told me it was their favorite All Pod. Tammy sold out the books but it is not too late to get your copy. Let me know and we can order your child a copy of her book for ten dollars. Tammy will sign the book. Please let me know by the end of the day on Thursday, June 2nd if you would like a copy of Tammy's first book.

So last week we had it all -- from the smallest of our children to a 27 year old graduate who is changing the world. Come join us on Saturday for what is always our biggest event of the year and in a student's school career, Graduation Day. If past is prologue, you will be in for a treat. Be here at 11:00. Don't miss out on our greatest celebration.
