MIDYEAR EXAM SCHEDULE

High School students in grades 9-12 will be taking midyear exams for their five core subjects on January 19-21, 2005. These exams will be 90 minutes in length and cover the first semester material. A separate grade for these exams will appear on the report card.

On Wednesday and Thursday, January 19 – 20, exams will be at 8:30 and 10:30. On Friday, January 21, there will be one exam at 8:30.
