FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

"Hey Mike, would you like to go to Honduras with us?" Thus began my discussion last week with Sophomore Dan Nardo, the leader of the Cultural Book Exchange Project, about joining the eight students who are going to La Esperanza, Honduras over the February break. Dan and the other students in the project have been working the first half of the year getting prepared for the trip: raising money, learning about Honduras, getting passports and getting excited. When Dan asked me to go, I had to remember the last time I spoke Spanish beyond a casual "hola!" or "que pasa?" Despite the thirty some years since my Spanish classes in high school, I was eager to sign on for the trip. We will be leaving Logan early this Sunday morning and returning late on March 1.

Spanish teacher, Howard Bean, has been the inspiration for this project. Prior to coming to work at SSCPS and also last summer, Howard worked and visited with the people of La Esperanza. He has established a friendship with teachers and school leaders at Southwest School in La Esperanza who will be hosting us as we learn about their country.

Projects are a founding element of our school. These international trips to countries such as Honduras often get a lot of attention, but there are projects all across the curriculum that are helping students to learn how to organize, create, cooperate, serve, write, promote and learn around new skills and ideas. Now that we are in one building, we will be looking for more interlevel cooperation between projects that will create new learning opportunities for everyone. SSCPS projects are unique to this school and are very different from other forms of teaching. Over the last year, we have been looking for ways to support our teachers as we make these project experiences more meaningful. Jessica Engebretson on Level 4 and Colin Gibney on Level 2 have begun discussions with staff about "experiential learning." If "learning-by-doing" is of interest to you as a parent or student you may want to join these discussions to help improve the learning environment as your school. The meetings are every Thursday at 3:30 in room 201 on Level 4.

Now that we have past the midpoint of the year, next week we all get to take a break to gather ourselves and be able to refocus on the remaining days. There has been some interest in how we are going to deal with all the snow days we have had so far. Currently we have missed 4 days of school due to snow. The State requires us to go to school for 180 days. Currently, if we don't change the calendar we will be in session until June 29. We are exploring ways to make up days between now and the end of the year so that we are not going that late into June. I will be announcing any changes to the school calendar the beginning of March.

Enjoy your week with the kids at home or on vacation and see you when I return from Honduras.
