## TEN YEARS OF PROGRESS

As you all probably know, this year is the $10^{\text {th }}$ year of operation for South Shore Charter Public School and for all the charter schools that were in the first group to be approved after the 1993 Education Reform Act. In celebration of this there will be several events both locally at our school and statewide to honor the strides charter schools have made in our commonwealth.

On Wednesday, May $4^{\text {th }}, ~ 6: 00$ PM-9:00 PM, there will be a $10^{\text {th }}$ Year Charter School Gala at the Boston Park Plaza Hotel to which all supporters of charter schools are invited. There will be student entertainment, legislators who have been supportive of our movement will be honored and the fourteen schools that celebrate their $10^{\text {th }}$ anniversary this year...including SSCPS.

Our school currently has one table reserved, but more are possible. Each table is $\$ 500$ for ten people ( $\$ 50 /$ person) or individual tickets are available for $\$ 75$. Teachers, parents, trustees, administrators, alumni and students (grades 7-12) are invited to attend this evening event.
