TICK SEASON IS UPON US

There have been a few reported cases of ticks on our students. Our wooded grounds are not immune from the little crawly things and students may pick them up most anywhere on campus, just as they can at home. We have consulted with our pest management company and been told that there is no chemically safe spray that can be used around children. Prevention is the best policy. The school does not allow students to play in the woods. Please teach your children – and check them daily – for ticks and other bugs. An informational flyer is attached that offers guidance on how to spot a tick and what to do if you find a tick on your child.
