Here we are at the end of our tenth year. It has been a year of huge growth, both collectively as a school and individually as 468 students and their families. Our challenges have been many and our resolve has been equal to those challenges. The move, the re-chartering, the new Parent Association, all thirteen grades in one building and numerous other events have made this year a lesson in cooperation. It has only been by working together that we have made this historic move to our permanent home and begun to work together as a full K-12 community that can look back in satisfaction at our work and see that it is good and that the future is bright for our school. Time and again I hear from people in our region about what they have heard regarding the strength of our program. The extensive waitlist of about 300 students attests to the need for a school like ours. Our teachers, our students, our staff and parents all make this community happen. At the end of this year today, we can take a moment to appreciate all we have and all we have done together and look forward to next year with anticipation.

This time of year signals a transition for many of us. Several families are moving out of the area; we wish them well in their new home. Several students will be continuing their education at other institutions; we know they will do wonderful things wherever they go. Several staff members are moving on to other realms of activity and I want to mention their contributions to our program.

Mark Veader, a nine-year veteran of the school, will be moving on to Brookline High School. Mark has been the Level Coordinator for the high school the last several years and taught upper level math. Mark also helped the school to expand its horizons by leading projects that traveled to Central and South America to aide some of the world's poor and hungry. He has touched many lives both here and abroad and we thank him for that.

Elaine French, has been a stalwart of our Learning Services program. Coming to us several years ago after her retirement from Hull schools, Elaine never quite acted like a typical retiree. To the contrary, she sets a pace for herself and the Learning Services team unrivaled in the school. With the transition this year in taking on 200+ new students, Elaine led the review of each student to ascertain each student's needs and made the necessary accommodations. Her cheerfulness, her skill, her professionalism and her boundless love of children of all ages will be sorely missed.

Vinnie Zappi, is moving to Florida. Vinnie is the man who has kept the wheels of the school greased the last five years. As our maintenance man, he kept all three buildings in Hull patched together and then masterfully coordinated our move to Norwell last summer. Forever positive and jovial, Vinnie has provided a ready hand to students, teachers and parents. Enjoy the sun, Vinnie.

Rich Levitt came to SSCPS in 2003 as our first Development Director. Taking on a monumental task to get the school's fundraising program going was no easy task and he has worked tirelessly to move the school forward internally and in making connections with the outside community. Rich was our first basketball coach and project coordinator as well. Due to budget constraints, we have to cut this position. Rich's work, dedication and the professionalism he has brought to the school will be missed.

Ashirah Klein, one of our Level 1 teachers, has decided it's time to get married and is moving to Pennsylvania to be with the man she loves...how wonderful is that? New to SSCPS this year, Ashirah quickly brought together a wonderful program for her students and has been an integral member of the Level 1 team. All the best in your new life, Ashirah!

Also new this year, Seth Jacobson has taught English in the high school and made some terrific connections with our students. Seth came to us from the Norwell Mariner and is considering heading back in that direction. Wherever you go Seth, best wishes.

Sheila Joyce our biology teacher will be teaching in Plymouth next year. Sheila has given the high school students a great flavor of the natural world around them and worked conscientiously to help us build a stronger science program.

Kevin Slesinsky, our robotics and math teacher in the high school is working on a program to teach in Boston next year. We thank him for his long hours and efforts to give students a taste of technology we didn't have previously.

Linda Hetue is moving to China. Our occupational therapist, Linda is following her husband, Harry Cochran (who has been on our Technology Committee) as he makes connections with the growing opportunities in Asia over the next few years. 祝好运
