Somewhere around 475 BC the Greek philosopher Sophocles said: "Success is dependent on effort." As a school, effort is something we prize. This past week we had some wonderful news that recognized effort on the part of our 10th grade class of last year (our current 11th grade). MCAS scores came out last week and *The Boston Globe* reported that South Shore Charter Public School was the **most improved school in Massachusetts** regarding 10th graders passing the MCAS on the first try. Along with nine other schools, 100% of our sophomores passed the MCAS. We were named the top school in improvement because our scores and the percentage of students passing rose more than any other school.

At an assembly with the high school students last Friday, level coordinator, Mark Veader said that while the success for the school was great, it "was the choice of each of those students last year to do their best, that helped them to pass." Our juniors have now set a standard for our sophomores when it comes to achieving the state's mandate for high school success. It is up to all of us to help each succeeding sophomore class to reach the same level of accomplishment.

It is not often that small schools get to say they are number one, so we will accept that honor today with humility, knowing that those students made an excellent effort and we have much still to do to raise the level of achievement for all our students.
