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FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

BEING GOOD NEIGHBORS

Poet Robert Frost in his work, "Mending Wall" repeats the phrase, "Good fences make good neighbors." This is an apropos statement considering our new residence here in Longwater Circle. We have moved into a neighborhood and brought about 300 cars with us. Those of you who have delivered or picked up your children at either end of the day know the congestion that has at time occurred on Longwater Circle and Longwater Drive. Our neighbors are having some difficulty adjusting to our presence here. We need to extend a hand to them and be "good neighbors." While the School has the right to be on Longwater Circle, being a good neighbor means we have responsibilities. These responsibilities involve and include: the school, the parents and the students. For the sake of brevity, I will focus on the issues around parents today.

Parents and families are adjusting to a new entity in our lives: SSCPS on Longwater Circle. It is a new location for the returning families and the new families. Everyone has been attempting to fit the travel time and location into their family schedule. Sometimes parents have been putting their schedule ahead of the school, their student, other students, other parents and our neighbors here in Assinippi Park. Regularly, some parents have been parking in neighboring property and having their student walk over to them disregarding the fact that all the property in the Park is PRIVATE. Parents have asked their children to walk into neighboring property where semi tractor-trailers are turning around. Sometimes they ask their child to walk through traffic zipping along on Longwater Circle. These are neither wise nor safe things to do.

The school sees three priorities for arrival and dismissal:

- 1. Student safety
- 2. Respecting neighbor property
- 3. Respecting other parents and staff

We have arranged a system of arrival that never allows a line to form on Longwater Circle. Dismissal has accomplished getting 468 students out of their classrooms and into cars or buses in less than fifteen minutes. Both of these are good accomplishments.

So what's the problem? The problem is that some parents are parking anywhere they like to pickup their student regardless of whose property they park on. The neighbors are getting irritated!

The School is asking:

- 1. That all parents to go through the car line to drop off or pick up their student.
- 2. That drivers not park on other property. (Weichart Relocation building is going to be fully occupied shortly and we will not have access to their parking during the day)
- 3. That those parents parking on school property and walking into the school with their children, control their children and not allow them to run ahead or between cars.
- 4. Those drivers who have picked up their child but have cars in front of them should not pull around those cars with there being a great possibility of students running between cars.

We do not want our neighbors to build walls but if some of our parents continue to disrespect neighboring property the neighbors could close themselves off to us. The school is making continuous overtures to the surrounding businesses to make partnerships with them and we are attempting to work out some arrangements. But all goodwill can go right out the window if respect is not practiced. The School needs parent help.

We like to teach the students that with rights come responsibilities. SSCPS has the right to be on Longwater Circle, but the members of our community have the responsibility to be good neighbors. Please be careful of children and do not park or use anyone else's property for your convenience.
