## From the Principals office

UPDATE ON THE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS
The faculty has devoted the professional development time on the early release days this year to a review of the English Language Arts curriculum and a revision of the curriculum maps for the other disciplines.

The process of mapping a curriculum is a lengthy and, at times, tedious process. However, it provides the faculty with an opportunity to review and reflect on what they teach, why they teach it, how they can improve student learning, and how it impacts the Massachusetts Frameworks and the MCAS exams. It is an essential tool in keeping our curriculum current and relevant.

The English Language Arts faculty has completed the curriculum maps for $\mathrm{K}-12$. They have begun the process of attaching the strands of the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks to the curriculum maps. This will be completed in March. The remainder of the year will be spent in completing the review process.

The Math teachers have begun the process of mapping the new Singapore Math curriculum. This is expected to take the remainder of the year.

The Science, Social Studies, Spanish, and Fine Arts are in the process of taking their current maps and revising them to fit a new more detailed model. The process of attaching the curriculum framework strands will then occur over the remainder of the year.

We are planning on completing the review of the English Language Arts curriculum, mapping the Singapore Math, and revising the curriculum maps for the other subjects by the end of the year. This will provide an up to date picture of our entire curriculum.

In February, we will be taking a break from our mapping to use the professional development time to discuss the issue of bullying. We will be having a speaker address this issue on February 1, 2006. More on that later.

## From the Health Office

## SCHOOL HEALTH REMINDERS

Please notify the School Nurse if you child is diagnosed with a communicable disease. Students may return to school as follows:

- Strep Throat - 24 to 48 hours after the first dose of medication and fever free.
- Scarlet Fever - 24 hours after medication has started.
- Chicken Pox - 7 days from appearance of first eruption, lesions crusted 24 hours, fever free.
- Pinworm - 24 to 48 hours after medication has begun.
- Pneumonia - physician's certification for reentry.
- Impetigo - 24 hours after treatment has begun.
- Head Lice - Students with head lice will be excluded from school for treatment. They may return to school 24 hours following treatment if found to be nit free and checked by the school nurse. Please consult your physician or pharmacist for an appropriate preparation.


## HEALTH RESTRICTIONS AND SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Please keep your child home if he/she has:

- An elevated temperature.
- A suspicious rash.
- Sore eyes or earache with discharge.
- Upset stomach or vomiting within the past 24hours.
- Contagious disease (strep throat, conjunctivitis, bronchitis, etc.)

Please note: your child must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.
