## From the Head of School

High school term exams are underway as I write this. One senior stopped in a few minutes ago to tell me she "failed" her Spanish exam. Upon further questioning her frustration, what she really meant to say was that she got a "B" on the exam. It is good to hear her concerned about her work. While the drama of not getting an "A" can be dismissed to youthful hyperbole, the underlying interest in doing well is what we are looking to see in all our students.

Recently we were notified by the Department of Education that three seniors have done very well. Nicole Campbell, Ariana Coveney and Debra Greene are among the recipients of this year's John and Abigail Adams Scholarships, because of their superior work on the MCAS. They are eligible through these scholarships to attend any Massachusetts state college or university tuition free for four years. I congratulate these three fine students for their work over their time in school and we are pleased they have received this recognition. Congratulations also to their parents and teachers for helping them get to this point of having increased options for their futures. This is the second year we have had students receive their scholarships, one of last year's graduates is attending UMass-Amherst this year on her scholarship.

On another topic, you are no doubt aware demand for admission to SSCPS has been extremely high for the last few years. We are gratified with the interest in our program and wish we could accommodate every interested student. However, we cannot. This week every current student's family should have received the 2006-2007 Intent to Return Form in the mail. It is vital that you return this form to the school by February 8 in order for the school to conduct its next Lottery. If we do not have a form on file by that date we will assume that your student will not be returning to SSCPS in the fall. This will allow us to offer the spot to a new student through the new Lottery. Family plans change, but if you are sure you will be sending your student to a different school next year for whatever reason, we need to know it now. ## From the Health Office

 SCHOOL HEALTH REMINDERSPlease notify the School Nurse if you child is diagnosed with a communicable disease. Students may return to school as follows:

- Strep Throat - 24 to 48 hours after the first dose of medication and fever free.
- Scarlet Fever - 24 hours after medication has started.
- Chicken Pox - 7 days from appearance of first eruption, lesions crusted 24hours, fever free.
- Pinworm - 24 to 48 hours after medication has begun.
- Pneumonia - physician's certification for reentry.
- Impetigo - 24 hours after treatment has begun.
- Head Lice - Students with head lice will be excluded from school for treatment. They may return to school 24 hours following treatment if found to be nit free and checked by the school nurse. Please consult your physician or pharmacist for an appropriate preparation.


## HEALTH RESTRICTIONS AND SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Please keep your child home if he/she has:

- An elevated temperature.
- A suspicious rash.
- Sore eyes or earache with discharge.
- Upset stomach or vomiting within the past 24hours.
- Contagious disease (strep throat, conjunctivitis, bronchitis, etc.)

Please note: your child must be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school.
