FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Skiing, skating, close of school announcements, exhibitions of mastery, the Lottery, vacation week...all are features of winter at the charter school. With one eye toward spring and the other enjoying the fun of winter we manage to stay focused on the work at hand. Last weekend the school held its annual Lottery. This year we had 283 applications across the grades. We took 41 students in Kindergarten, 1 in fourth grade, 3 in eighth grade and 10 in ninth grade. With this we will be at an enrollment of 488 in August 2006. This will be the largest enrollment for the school.

There are many rumors flying around about the growth of the enrollment at school. Let me try to clear some of them up. In January the State Board of Education granted SSCPS an increased enrollment cap of 540, 72 students more than our old cap. The school will reach this new level of enrollment gradually over several years...possibly as many as five years. For 2006, we will be twenty students larger than we are this year. This growth will be primarily in the high school grades. More and more students are opting to continue their high school education here at SSCPS rather than their district or other school, thus the increased retention from eighth to ninth grade is growing the high school numbers. Along with that we will have more seniors next year. The class of 2006 is sixteen students; the class of 2007 will be 31. The success of the high school is drawing students. The enrollment increase is needed to fund the operations of the school. In order to pay our teachers respectable salaries and deal with the rising costs of utilities and other operations, the school must increase its enrollment.

This increased enrollment is requiring minimal construction this summer. We will be renovating the biology/chemistry science lab and expanding Room 100. As we add more students to reach the 540 number we will have to add classrooms. This will be done as we raise the monies to fund that construction. We are currently waiting on our architect's development of a master plan to complete the renovation of the school. Included in the renovation will be the library, "cafegymtorium," lower grades' science room and other tutoring space. We will only be able to add more students to the school as we can complete the renovation of the building. Thus, it will probably take several years to accomplish. However, that being said, there were a few people three years ago that felt we wouldn't be able to purchase our school facility, but we did it. It is that same optimism that will allow us to finish the school and to grow the enrollment and keep our school strong and dynamic.

At the Parent Association meeting last week, Mike Nuesse, treasurer of the Board, gave the parents and overview of the financial situation of the school. One of his points showed that the money raised by the parents comprises just over 1% of the total revenue of the school. However, that \$50,000 is critical to the welfare of the program. Thus, it is so important that every family contribute to the Annual Fund each year. In addition, the school and charter foundation is constantly exploring other options for added revenue: foundations, companies, individuals, who can support the work the teachers are doing with our children.

Enjoy your week off and we will see everyone back at school on February 27th. *Mike Munhall*
