## From the Head of School

Our universe is a marvelous place of a near infinite variety of formations, creatures, cultures and beliefs. It is the variety of the universe that gives us as humans the challenge to understand what it is we are surrounded by. Thus we study science, social studies, history, anthropology, religion, philosophy, art, languages and many other topics.

A year ago, the plans for the "Day of Silence" seemed to create a firestorm of interest among many parents in the community. The Parent Discussion Forum was rife with emails pro and con on the topic and demanding that the administration do something. Once again the Parent Forum is filling with comments about the latest plans for this day of support for gay and lesbian students. Some are asking why the administration hasn't done anything to get control of the topic and diversity in general. For those who enjoy reacting to events rather than planning them, I can see why they are upset.

In September, two school moms came together to form the Diversity Committee of the Parent Association. Cassie Proude and Natalie Hill met several times and encouraged the participation of other parents; no one responded. These two parents made overtures to the Town of Norwell for an International Festival to be held at the Charter School, but plans fell through because the festival would have needed many parents to coordinate it...we didn't have the backing. The School hosted the South Shore Multicultural Job Fair in February to encourage the employment of a diverse group of educators at all South Shore schools.

There has been a group of parents that has met twice to talk, initially about bullying, but now is focused more on the "climate" of the school. Bullying is a symptom, not a cause of the climate at the school. This group has had some ideas on the topic. Naturally neither they nor the school want to see any student being victimized or bullied. However, looking at the whole school and assessing the issues in a constructive fashion takes more than a few meetings. We are researching ways to look at the climate of the school. There is a whole science around what makes school cultures work and what causes them to be dysfunctional. We will be assessing what our climate is like.

Once we have some data on the causes of the problems we are facing we will need parents, students, staff and administration to tackle the solutions and not just to point fingers. We are a community of people ranging in age from infants to grandparents. We need to understand one another, support each other, respect one another and learn to live with everyone. The School is attempting to tackle the issues of being a larger, regional school in one building. Your school needs your help. Join the Parent Association; be involved in Board, school and PA committees. Together we can learn to live together in greater harmony.
