# From the Head of School

Many families all over the Commonwealth were huddled around their televisions this past weekend watching the excitement of the NCAA Basketball Tournament. College men deftly maneuvered the ball up and down the court to score points that could lead them to high paying professional NBA positions. At the same time, hidden away at Boston University's Agganis Arena was a room the generated an equivalent amount of energy and cheering focused on scoring baskets, but with a different goal in mind. Dressed in sometimes bizarre colored outfits, these fans and athletes were using <u>robots</u> to score their points. The robots they had designed were able to score points in two areas: shooting low one point shots or high five pointers. Each design was unique but they could all do similar feats. These high school athletes, with the help of university mentors, were pushing themselves to excel at mind skills more than muscle skills. First Robotics <u>http://www.usfirst.org/</u> competition was holding its Boston Regional Competition.

Three of our charter students were involved in this competition. High Schoolers Dan Tod, Rob O'Leary and Jim Demore were apart of the competition this year. South Shore Charter Public School was partnered with Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Cambridge Rindge and Latin High School, and Chelsea High School in and together comprised Team 97 "the RoboRuminants." Over a year ago, Dan Tod made a connection with a student at MIT about the First Robotics program. Dan got a few of his classmates interested and they spent three or four nights a week this winter commuting on the T to MIT to work on their robot. Given a challenge from the founder of First Robotics, New Hampshire inventor Dean Kamen, who invented the Segway people mover and holds over 150 patents on other devices, each team had to design a robot that could pick up balls and shoot them into two types of goals. Having visited the workroom and the competition on Saturday, I was amazed to see the depth of commitment of not only our students but high school students, university students, parents, adult professors/teacher and inventors from all over the nation as they built these robots and in cutthroat competition tried to out compete other teams. One team had a banner that summarized the work of much of what I saw in this competition: "We Not Me." Similar to what we hope to see come out of our "Project" curriculum here at school, over and over I could see students committing to working as a team to make their robot the best.

These students probably won't get NBA contracts, but the chances that down the road they will use their intelligence and curiosity to develop something that helps solve their community, their nation or their world overcome a problem are good. MIT wants our students to be a permanent part of Team 97 and will provide student mentors to help with next year's challenge. I would encourage any high school student interested in team building, technology, engineering or inventing to join this marvelous program. There are many programs around our area that help students to show enthusiasm for learning, I hope if students are interested they, or their families, take the time to get involved. I would also like to praise Dan Tod for showing the initiative to get this program going for himself, his friends and his school. Take a few moments next time you are in the building to look at pictures of Saturday's competition on the glass wall. Also, our team came in 8<sup>th</sup> out of 40 teams...well done guys!
