From the Head of School

May 1-6, 2006 is National Charter Schools Week. As I look down our main hallway this morning and see the "community chain" that is hanging from the ceiling representing all the students and staff in the school, I am heartened that our little school is part of a larger national movement to make education better for all students. Even though I have been with the school a mere four years, the stories I have heard about the founding days of the school demonstrate the passion felt by those early SSCPS pioneers as they looked to find something better for their children. While in some ways we are different than that school of eleven years ago, we still need people of passion for charter schools to speak up as our state legislators once again juggle the funding process that is so key to the financial health of the school.

The latest challenge to charter schools is from the Massachusetts School Superintendents Association. Their proposal is before the legislature as Amendment 1520, filed by Representative Deborah Blumer (Framingham). This amendment in essence limits the individual town districts to a \$5,000 contribution to a student's education at a charter school. \$5,000 is about half of the current tuition funding SSCPS gets for each student. If this amendment passes, it would leave the charter schools in the position of each year having to go to the state legislature to get more funding make up the difference. Since the districts would get more than their full funding with the this Blumer Amendment while charter schools would get less, the Massachusetts Charter Public School Association has gone on record as opposing the passing of this act. The legislature is considering and may vote on this bill this week.

While charter schools celebrate their work next week, they/we can never take for granted what they have. There are political forces that feel threatened by our existence and look for ways to undo our good work. Thank you for your continued support.
