## From the Head of School

Welcome to the 2005-2006 school year. I trust that everyone had a restful and fun summer and are back to work hard and come together for new endeavors of learning. The faculty, new and returning, have been making plans all summer to invigorate and expand on what we had in place. Those of you who have been in the building have noticed new painting on each level to make one area of the building distinct from another. Our maintenance director, Paul Connick, has been working diligently to upgrade the condition of the building over the summer. The faculty got together last Friday at Camp Wing in Duxbury to do some team-building with the new and returning faculty. After six hours of challenges and games the staff felt much more connected.

The theme for this year is "Reaching Out." Last year we spent a good deal of time focusing on the move to Norwell and getting used to a bigger school in a new building with many new faces. To recharge the part of our mission to be involved in our greater community we have taken the opportunity to recharge our community service program. We are looking for everyone, at their level, to make the opportunity to work with other students and staff, other levels and the community of the South Shore and beyond. We will be doing more with accountability of the community service program as our new charter accountability plan asks for greater documentation of out reach work we as a school do. SSCPS is a regional school to the entire South Shore and we need each community in our area to know that they have an interest in us as much as we have an interest in them. More on community service will be out in the next few weeks.

There are a few items of which families need to be reminded. ALL FORMS: please be sure the school has all the forms on your child on file by the end of this week. Emergency information, health records updated, income eligibility forms for free and reduced lunch all need to be on file for us to work with your child. CORI forms (from the Criminal History Systems Board) have to be redone this year for all volunteers working with students of any age. The process now includes you personally meeting with Pam Algera, my assistant, or Kristine Shipps, our business manager, to have your photo ID recorded on the CORI form. You can get the forms at the front desk at school.

PARKING: please do not park in the last area by the playground in back of the school during the school day as this is the students recess area. We have permission to use the lot just prior to our entrance that belongs to Weichert Relocation.

The new members of our professional staff bring a wealth of experience to the school this year. I am going to give you a quick biography of each new member of the staff.

- John Henry Angell (Level 2 Aide) is transitioning from the graphic arts field to education and while he is working on his Masters, he will be supporting the Level 2 program. A graduate of Connecticut College, John Henry has worked at the Cambridge Friends School and Big Brothers of Massachusetts.
- Hanora Broderick is not a stranger to SSCPS as she was a Level 1 aide last year and has now taken over a Level 1 classroom. A graduate of the University of Dublin and the University College Galway, Nora has also been a Fulbright Scholar in literature at Boston College. She brings to us her experience as a teacher in Ireland, France and the US.
- Lucille Butler (part time music) a graduate of Newton College of the Sacred Heart, she is an accomplish vocalist sings everything from opera to musical theatre and rock and has operated a private voice studio in Norwell.
- Cynthia Chapman (Level 1 aide) is a resident of Scituate has been coordinator of volunteers at the South Shore Natural Science Center. With a degree in marketing from Providence College, Cynthia has worked on theatre and advertising as well as at several private schools.
- Paul Connick (Facilities Manager) Paul joined us in June and took charge of closing down our last building in Hull at 120 Nantasket. Paul is uniquely skilled for his position in that he was the facilities manager for our building when it was owned by Serono Pharmaceuticals.
- Ed Dormady (high school math) With a Master of Arts in Teaching Secondary School Mathematics, Ed will be handling the advanced math course in the high school this year. He has been an instructor at Northeastern University, an adjunct professor at Lesley University and a math teacher at Frederick Douglas Charter School and Pope John XXIII High School in Everett, Ed has also been in the computer industry for several years.
- Erin Cota (Occupational Therapist Aide) With a degree in Occupational Therapy from Mount Ida College, Erin has worked in Quincy Public Schools and for Therapy Resource Management in Fall River.
- Will Glennon (physical education teacher and Athletic Director) A native of the Cape, Will has worked at Cape Cod Lighthouse School and coached for Nauset Regional High School and most recently worked at The Home for Little Wanderers. A graduate of the University of Massachusetts, Amherst in sports management, Will is going to oversee the development of our student activities and sports.
- Leslie Jubinville (high school biology and chemistry) Leslie is another member of the Frederick Douglas Charter School to join us this year. A graduate of Fitchburg State College and completing her Masters at University of Phoenix, Leslie has also taught science at Eagle Hill School and Assabet Valley Technical High School.
