FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Parents and Cell Phones -Three weeks ago I was on the Cape for the Labor Day weekend. While driving around I noticed a bumper sticker that, while it was rather direct in its message, was applicable to something we here at school have struggled with over the last year or more. The bumper sticker read: "Shut the Cell Up!"

As you are aware we have a policy for students that they are not allowed to use their cell phones on campus between 8:15 and 3:00. However, at dismissal time we have a new issue regarding cell phones: parents. On any given day there will be a raft of parents pulling into the school property oblivious to people giving directions and not observing students crossing driveways because the parent/driver is engaged in an animated conversation on his or her cell phone. This is not a safe situation for the students, dismissal staff or the drivers. At dismissal time, and arrival for that matter, the sole priority is the safety of the students. There is plenty of time for phone conversations once you are away from campus, but on campus pedestrians come before phone calls.

This week's Level 1 saying is: "Better Safe Than Sorry." It would be wise for every parent to take this to heart when in his or her car in a crowded area like the school driveway. We do not want to have to look back on a situation and wish someone hadn't been on his or her phone because they didn't see a student (or adult) crossing. PLEASE DO NOT USE YOUR CELL PHONE WHILE YOUR CAR IS MOVING ON CAMPUS. Thanks for your cooperation.

Students will work with Craig Bloodgood, an artist and Duxbury Art Complex Museum Curator to design and build their own board games of strategy and skill. Students will keep inventors notebooks, test each other's ideas and build a three-dimensional board game from a variety of wooden parts and found objects.

During the second part of the semester, students will learn about mazes and labyrinths. They will design a temporary project on the grounds of the school and also create a small tabletop maze for themselves.

Craig is a sculptor who has shown his work in solo museum exhibitions in both the Fuller Craft Museum and the Newport Art Museum. His game Roofer Madness was recently the focus of one of those exhibitions and featured in *The Boston Globe* and *American Craft Magazine*.


