FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

This fall our school has benefited incredibly from the commitment of our parent volunteers. We all are aware of the plans that are quickly coming to fruition around the Shining Stars Auction on November 5. With only the dedicated work of a legion of parent decorators, parent chair-painting coordinators, and parent food preparers is this auction coming together. But at the same time these preparations are moving along, other parents are filling in here and there all around the school. Prior to Mariclare Cheney being hired as the new Assistant to the Principal at the front desk, many parents volunteered hours of coverage to assist Ellen Lothrop with the many functions that go through the front desk each day...thank you all for that support! While our numbers where far stronger than our opponents, the anti-charter school people are well organized and forceful. We cannot underestimate their power in the halls of DOE and the legislature. I thank those parents who went in the van and those who took time from work in the city and joined us at the state house. I wish I could say this would be the last time we will have to go to the state house to ensure our school's survival, but it is only the latest visit. However, if anything will keep charter schools alive in Massachusetts it is this parental show of support...thank you all. FACTS ABOUT BACKPACK INJURY

Carrying an overloaded backpack can cause painful back and neck problem and injuries, possibly leading to long-term medical problems. Medical professionals advise that individuals carry no more than 10-15% of their body weight on their backs.

Examples: A student weighing:

- 50 lbs should carry no more than 7.5 lbs.
- 80 lbs. should carry no more that 12 lbs.
- 100 lbs should carry no more than 15 lbs.
- 130 lbs. should carry no more than 19.5 lbs.

Please weigh your student and his/her fully loaded backpack. If you find it weighs more that 15% of his/ her body weight, help your student lighten the load.

Tips on Wearing a Backpack Properly

- Distribute weight evenly. Put heavier items on bottom to keep weight off the shoulders.
- Choose a backpack that has heavily padded shoulder straps and lumbar support. Padded shoulder straps offer cushioning for the trapezoids muscles and the clavicle bones. The lumbar support cushions the lumbar spine and redistributes the weight to the legs.
- Bend you knees when lifting a backpack.
- Carry only the necessities. (Clean out the backpack at least once a week.)
