### FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

The Legislature's Education Committee is conducting a statewide "Listening Tour" on education reform issues including charter schools. These hearings are open to the public and will be less formal than the recent state house hearing. The local meeting will be at Rockland High School next Tuesday, November 8 at 4:30 PM. Rockland High School is on Mackinlay Way in Rockland, about 10 minutes from school.

It is very important that the committee see charter school parents at these events. We encourage you to attend, and since the hearings are after school, we encourage you to bring your charter school students. If they wish, they may testify. The important message is that charter schools are serving you and your family well and the Legislature should not do anything to harm them. If you'd like to speak in support of House bill 1055 to raise the cap on charter schools in under performing districts or against HB 1131 that would change the charter school funding formula, you can do so. Talking points are attached.

Please let me know if you have any questions.

Funding for charter schools is a perennial challenge for us and even when the state gives us the most it can, it is not enough to meet our annual budget. Thus we have our annual auction: *A Night for Our Shining Stars*. Presented by Phil Hulbig. Mr. Hulbig has been providing advocacy and informative seminars for parents and educational personnel working with exceptional children for ten years. He is a certified moderate special needs teacher, presently runs the Therapeutic Learning Center for the Franklin Public School system, and is living with learning disabilities. Also in attendance will be a representative from the Hanover High School Guidance Department.

This program is a highly informative and entertaining first person account of what it takes to live successfully with learning disabilities. It examines the unique issues learning disabilities can have on family, school, college, and work. It will focus on how to prepare and ease the transition to higher education. The goal of the program is to provide a positive and holistic look at the world of the learning disabled while suggesting practical approaches to achieving personal success.
