## From the Head of School

This has been a week of accomplishments. Those of you who attended "A Night for Our Shining Stars" last Saturday will attest to what a wonderful event it was. Parent Fundraising Chairman, Debbie Shepherd and her committee of parent workers created a magical environment in the school that allowed parents and friends to join together in support of the school. KT Leary coordinating parent volunteer chefs, worked wonders around the four themed food tables and set a sumptuous spread for all. Tara Iorio along with Tim and Janet Coletti created the starlit world of constellations and twinkling lights. Student-made silver stars were suspended from the ceiling. Colleen Whittemore and her team workers were behind the scenes keeping track of purchases. Parents: Malee Nuesse and David Kellem took charge of the live auction and got the crowd bidding up the many wonderful items. The student furniture was a big hit with some parents caught in bidding wars to get their child's class chair. Many other parents helped in various ways in setting up and cleaning up, finding donors, baking, and giving ideas. In all, it was a marvelous event for our community to come together in sustaining the work done here at SSCPS. The proceeds from the evening total approximately $\$ 25,000$; a wonderful step toward our goal of raising \$50,000 this year.

Last Saturday also was the concluding game of the inaugural soccer season for our team. While we lost (2-3) the tournament match with Codman Academy we ended the season with a 3-2 record in the Massachusetts Charter School Athletic League. Beyond that, our athletes played the season with a lot of energy, enthusiasm and spirit. The League recognized several of our community for outstanding work this fall. Jackie Hannigan ( $8^{\text {th }}$ grade) was named MVP of the League. Jon Alexandre ( $11^{\text {th }}$ ), Hannah Connolly ( $11^{\text {th }}$ ), Debra Greene ( $12^{\text {th }}$ ), and Luke Ryan $\left(9^{\text {th }}\right)$ all received All-League commendations. And our Athletic Director, Will Glennon, was named League Soccer Coach of the Year. I extend our hearty congratulations to the entire team for a great season.

Yesterday the South Shore Charter Public School Chapter of the National Honor Society was reactivated with the induction of seven juniors and seniors. Chapter advisor, Megan Stoehr, spoke of the qualifications for society membership: scholarship, service, character and leadership. On a vote by the high school faculty these students were inducted: Nicole Campbell ( $\left.12^{\text {th }}\right)$, Hannah Connolly ( $11^{\text {th }}$ ), Debra Greene ( $12^{\text {th }}$ ), Greg Josselyn $\left(12^{\text {th }}\right)$, Amanda Kayiales $\left(12^{\text {th }}\right)$, Jane Sullivan $\left(11^{\text {th }}\right)$, and Megan Weinstein ( $11^{\text {th }}$ ). In his closing remarks, Dr. Gorsuch congratulated the new members for their accomplishments to date and encouraged all students to work to their fullest abilities in all they do here at school and in life.
