ECO-TIPS FROM THE SSCPS GREEN TEAM

We're now in the **DRY** time of year where house humidity can be lower than the desert (average home humidity this time of year: 14%). Here are some tips to help your skin stay moist and supple, without getting the toxins that are found in most moisturizers.

- <u>Use a humidifier</u>: These can add a huge amount of much needed moisture to the air in your home, which helps your nasal passages, helps you sleep, and helps to keep your skin from flaking and itching.
- <u>Drink lots of water</u>: Hydrate from the inside out. This helps skin and mucous membranes stay moist, plus lots of water flushes toxins from the body.
- <u>Eat Fish at least Twice a Week</u>: Oils in salmon, herring and other cold water fish are rich in Omega-3 fatty acids, which help replenish lost moisture in dry skin and hair.
- <u>Home Made Moisturizer</u>: A great toxin-free home-made moisturizer is olive oil great on chapped hands, dry cuticles, feet and elbows. Rub in well at night. To remedy dry/flaky hair, rub small amounts of Olive Oil in to your entire scalp, cover with a piece of plastic wrap and leave for 15 to 30 minutes. Then shampoo and condition as usual.
- Morning Skin Cleanser/Rejuvenator: Every morning 15 minutes before taking your bath, mix the following, and rub it all over.
