It is the legally binding contract which explains how the student will receive access to the general curriculum as well as which supports and services will be provided for success in all areas of the school. Every child with a disability who receives special education services must have an Individual Education Program. This workshop takes parents step-by-step through the development of the IEP including how to articulate a vision, using evaluation to write annual measurable goals and how to measure their child's progress.

ECO-TIPS FROM THE SSCPS GREEN TEAM

<u> Aluminum – The Silent Toxin</u>

It's the most abundant metal on earth, but scientists are just starting to understand the toxic role aluminum can play in our lives. Aluminum is a persistent neuro-toxin, and apparently plays a strong role in the development of Alzheimer's disease. Higher than normal levels of aluminum can also act as a contributing factor to behavioral/learning disorders including ADD and ADHD. Low-level aluminum poisoning has been implicated in other maladies, including: chronic fatigue, headaches, osteoporosis, fibromyalgia, vertigo, and memory loss. As parents, what can we do? To minimize absorption of aluminum, avoid anti-perspirants and switch to deodorants or solid natural salts; avoid aluminum containing antacids (avoid Mylanta and Maalox – Tums and Rolaids are fine); don't use food from aluminum cookware and use stainless steel, ceramic or porcelain. Foods rich in sulfur can help eliminate aluminum, so add cabbage, beans, lentils, onions and garlic to your diet. These simple steps can help you and your family minimize the build-up of aluminum in your body.
