FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Torri Wightman's parents have created a scholarship award for this school year. Last May, Torri, a 10th grade student at SSCPS at the time, lost her life in an automobile accident. In memoriam to Torri there was an outpouring of contributions to The Torri Wightman Memorial Fund for use at the school. Earlier this year the Fund paid for SSCPS high school students with driver's licenses to take a driver safety course. The Fund is now establishing a scholarship award to be given at commencement this June 2. The description of the scholarship is below. Torri was a creative student and this scholarship is reflective of that.

THE TORRI WIGHTMAN SCHOLARSHIP

The Torri Wightman Scholarship will be awarded at the June 2, 2007 graduation to a current 11th or 12th grade South Shore Charter Public School student who has demonstrated a high level of creativity in expressing the impact of a life-changing event. This may be demonstrated through poetry, written and performed music, a written play, a drawing, painting, sculpture, photography or similar work. Upon graduation from South Shore Charter Public School the recipient will receive the award.

Students submitting work should prepare it in the following manner:

- The piece submitted should be totally student generated and completed.
- The entries will be judged anonymously, the name of the creator should not appear on the work itself.
- On the back of the work or on an envelop containing the work the name of the student and grade should be clearly printed.
- Photographs, drawings, paintings or similar work should be mounted on matte board with the artist's name on the back.
- A piece of music should be recorded on a tape or CD and submitted along with the written score.
- The student may also submit a written explanation of how their creation demonstrates the impact of the event.

All submissions should be given to the Assistant to the Executive Director prior May 15, 2007. The Assistant to the Executive Director will code the entries, so that only she will know the identity of the entrants.

The award in 2007 will be a \$5,000 check made out to the student and his/her college.

ECO-TIPS FROM THE SSCPS GREEN TEAM PRUNING AND YOUR LANDSCAPE

<u>Fruiting Trees</u> – Mid- to late-March is the ideal time to prune fruiting trees. First prune out dead wood, obvious from the brittle tips and lack of any buds. Then look for crossing branches that are rubbing against each other, and remove the least desirable of these two branches. Cut off any shoots or small branches that are going straight up (called water sprouts), trying to cut just outside of the swelling (called the branch collar) where the to-be-pruned branch meets the trunk or larger branch. Lastly, thin out selected smaller shoots to promote sunlight and air to circulate in the crown of the tree. Never cut any tree in to a 'ball' shape . . . natural reach on the branches is nearly always optimal for best aesthetics and for the continued health of the tree. <u>Maples</u> – Now is NOT the time to prune Maples, since they will run sap for months if you wound them. If you need to prune one of your Maples, wait until August but no later than early September. <u>Rhododendrons and Azaleas</u> – prune immediately after they have finished blooming and no later than July 1 or you'll risk cutting

off the buds the plant is forming for blossoms next spring. Other flowering Shrubs – If a shrub blooms in the summer, it can be pruned in the early spring. If a shrub is a spring bloomer, then prune right after it blossoms. To learn how to use the right tools to make the best cut, check out this website: http://www.tree-pruning.com/ Please remember that many trees and shrubs need no pruning at all. For the easiest landscape to maintain, put the right plant in the right place and the plant will almost always take care of itself.
