On Tuesday, May 8 the faculty had its last professional development day of the year. The high school worked on the finalization of the curriculum for the senior projects and advisory program, a group of twelve teachers worked on the Life Skills curriculum for the projects/workshops, and the remainder of the faculty worked on unwrapping standards for the Science and where possible began the Social Studies curriculum.

A big thank you to all the parents who prepared and served a delicious lunch for the faculty on Tuesday. It was much appreciated and enjoyed by everyone!!

Please make a note that the spring concert date has been changed to Wednesday, May 30 at 6PM at Hingham High School.

A reminder that next week begins about three weeks of MCAS exams. This month students in grade 3-10 will be taking Math, Science, and Social Studies. The exam schedule is as follows

Level II - Grades 3 and 4 will be taking their Math exam on May 22 and 24 in the morning. This is a change from what was published last week.

Level III - Grades 5 and 6 will be taking their Math exam on May 15 and 16, Grade 5 will be taking a Social Studies exam on May 17 and their Science exam on May 22 and 23.

Level IV - Grades 7 and 8 will take their Math exam on May 14 and 16, and Grade 7 will have their Social Studies exam on May 21 and 23 and Grade 8 will have their Science exam on May 21 and 23.

High School - Grade 10 will have their competency determination Math exam on May 22 and 23, Grade 11 will take a Social Studies exam on May 24 and 25, Grade 9 will be taking a Biology exam on June 5 and 6. This grade 9 exam in Biology is one that they will have to pass in order to graduate from a public high school in Massachusetts.

To keep everyone updated- we began interviews for new teachers on Level 1 and 4 last week and will be interviewing for Level 2 and the high school this week. Our thanks to the parents and students who will be assisting in this most important task. We should know in a week or so the results of our search.
