#### **ECO-TIPS FROM THE SSCPS GREEN TEAM**

#### "Bag it!"

A great way to have a beautiful lawn, and save both time and money, is to use a mulching lawn mower. Rather than ejecting the cut grass pieces out a side chute, mulching mowers cut and re-cut each grass clipping in to tiny pieces. These small pieces stay on the lawn, break down quickly, and give your lawn a lovely, organic, free, nitrogen-rich feed. Exactly what your lawn is craving.

And, no . . . this will \*not\* contribute to the dreaded thatch. "Thatch" is not what most people think it is . . . true thatch is a relatively impermeable layer of compacted grass roots in the top inch or two of soil. Thatch is caused by improper watering and fertilizing, coupled with poor maintenance practices.

Your current non-mulching lawn mower or lawn tractor can be converted in to a pretty good mulching mower with various attachments sold by lawn equipment companies. With any mowing, still keep in mind the cardinal rules: make sure your blade is very sharp, raise your blade height to 3 1/2 to 4 inches, cut more frequently when the grass is growing rapidly (Spring and Fall), remove only up to 1/3 of the grass blade, and mow only when the lawn is absolutely dry.

So! <u>Bag the bagging</u>... and enjoy more time for playing on the lawn, not maintaining it! Speaking of BAGGING IT ... Did you know it takes 1,000 years for plastic bags to decompose in landfills!!! Plastic bags choke sea turtles, whales and porpoises. And because they are made from polyethylene they increase our dependence on foreign oil and contribute to global warming. The state senator Brian Joyce from Milton is about to file legislation that would levy a fee on non-compost able plastic bags at big retailers. The fee, paid by customers, would start at 2 cents per bag in 2008 and rise to 15 cents by 2014.
