BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Annual Meeting of the Board of Trustees was held on May 29th and the results of the Nominating Ballot and By Law Amendment were announced. The Board welcomes the new and returning members to the Board. At the Regular Board Meeting held immediately following the Annual Meeting, the Board voted the recommendation of the Personnel Committee and the Executive Committee to appoint Kristine Shipps as the Acting Executive Director upon the departure of Mike Munhall. The Board also approved the process for the permanent replacement of the Executive Director. The Board will interview and hire an Interim Executive Director for a one year appointment which will start on or before August 10, 2007. During the 2007-08 school year the Board will actively proceed with the search, interview and hire of a permanent Executive Director. Bob Gass, Board of Trustee Chair will be attending the Parents' Association meeting on Tuesday, June 5th to clarify the process and answer questions from the community.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I have been asked to remind everyone about the dress code now that the warm weather is finally with us. Please take the time to review the dress code with your child. Thanks for your help.

DRESS CODE— The South Shore Charter Public School is a learning environment and students are expected to take pride in their appearance and to come dressed in an appropriate manner prepared to learn. As such, parents are expected to monitor the attire of their children. All students, faculty, staff and visitors must abide by the following dress code. Violators may be asked to leave the school premises and/or be subject to the school's disciplinary code. The Administration reserves the right to determine what may be considered appropriate clothing.

All students, faculty, staff and visitors must abide by the following dress code or you may be asked to leave the school premises or be subject to the school's disciplinary code.

- No profanity, offensive language or symbols, offensive or insinuating imagery, drug, alcohol, or tobacco language or symbols may be displayed on clothing, backpacks, etc.
- Shorts or skirts must be as long as the tips of one's fingers with arms held to their sides.
- The straps of tank tops, shirts (etc) must be at least one inch in width.
- Midriff and stomach area must remain covered at all times.
- Clothing must be clean and in good repair.
- All clothing must be worn in an appropriate manner as judged by faculty.
- Dress code for field trips, after school and extracurricular activities is the school dress code
 or can be modified at the discretion of the Administration in consultation with the activity
 advisor.

NICOLE'S LEVEL 2 ART FORCE PROJECT NEEDS YOUR HELP! The project is collecting paper towels, trash bags, and cat food (wet or dry) for the Quincy Animal Shelter. The donations are being collected in Nicole's pod or in the bin in the Level 2 Great Room. Thank you!

LEVEL 3 CROSS GENERATIONAL PROJECT, lead by John Costanzo, has been very busy this school year. This SSCPS project has visited nursing homes, bringing handmade gifts, collected gifts for "Toys for Tots", and adopted the non-profit organization of Lakota Kidz as their most passionate charitable undertaking. In order to raise funds to provide heat for homes in poverty-stricken Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota, which is home to the Lakota Sioux nation, students sold 'Johnny Cupcakes' pins, and designed and had printed posters and bumper stickers. This established a working relationship between John's students and the S.S. VoTech School printing department, in the process. The students then sold their bumper stickers, raffled off a scooter, 2 computer 'voice' soft-ware programs, and hand-made jewelry to raise funds to heat children's homes this winter.

Besides raising funds, the Cross Generational project posted information at SSCPS to help spread awareness of the level of poverty in Wanblee, the poorest town in Pine Ridge Reservation. A direct result of

this publicity enabled the students to have approx. 200 children's coats donated by the company Rugged Bear- for shipment to Wanblee this fall. With the money the students raised, shipping costs for the coats will be covered, and 3 homes will receive heat vouchers.

The Cross Generational project's publicity for Lakota Kidz inspired 2 local churches to join in the fundraising and awareness efforts, with a bake sale, an arts and craft sale and handmade quilt raffle. One church also collected funds to purchase and donate bikes to the younger kids in the Head Start program in Wanblee. John, and his project students, have shown intergenerational and intercultural compassion, creativity, salesmanship, partnership, and demonstrated the power of kindness, even when it is performed anonymously as it will be in Pine Ridge.
