#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Our year began with a faculty retreat and days of meetings and professional development. This year we have begun our efforts into differentiated instruction. While some have probably heard the term, for many it is unknown jargon. To be brief, differentiated instruction focuses on whom we teach, where we teach, and how we teach. Its primary goal is ensuring that teachers focus on processes and procedures that ensure effective learning for all students. Thus we want to ensure that the wide range of students at our school is being effectively and appropriately challenged in the classroom and are learning that the optimal rate.

This year we will be spending three of our professional development days with a team from the University of Connecticut's National Center for Gifted and Talented Education on how to differentiate instruction for our students. This professional development will continue in the coming years.

During the summer, we continued the training in Singapore Math that began last year. This program has been a refreshing and effective change and the students are much more engaged in Math. This training will continue during the year and our teachers will be making visits to other schools that are using the Singapore Math curriculum.

We will also begin work on developing a "data culture." A small team of teachers and administrators participated in a data driven decision making workshop and training. This will continue throughout the next two years. The purpose of this is to learn how to more effectively use the large amount of information we have from various types of testing and other sources to make decisions to improve student learning. This will be an evolutionary process with more to come in the second half of the year. A professional development day has been scheduled for this in February.

Last year, we began our review of the English Language Arts curriculum for grades K -12. We are in the final stages of the review that will be completed shortly. Thus far it has resulted in refinements in the high school curriculum and precision in our alignment with the Mass Curriculum Frameworks. With the impending implementation of the 9/10<sup>th</sup> grade MCAS test for Science for this year, we will begin a review of the Science curriculum for K-12. This will be taken up in this year's Education Committed and during professional development time on early release days.

A number of our teachers in grades K -6 went to Open Circle training this summer and are looking forward to fully implementing the curriculum this year.

Another group of Level 1 and 2 teachers received training on the DIBELS reading inventory. This will be used with our students on those levels to more closely monitor their reading progress and be able to intervene more quickly with those students that may be experiencing difficulty.

It has been a busy and productive summer. The year has started off very well and we are all excited about the new initiatives and curriculum and instruction we are implementing this year.
