FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

There are a couple of Charter moms who are spearheading this year's Community Week. Cassie Proude, Natalie Hill and Stacy Rousseau, our Parent Association Diversity Committee, have been working for the last month to design a week that will bring the school together and accentuate the strengths of our school community. The week of October 16-20 will be Community Week this year. Among the activities of the week will be things that show what a wonderfully diverse community we are and also how we can as a whole work together for better understanding among those diverse groups and how the understanding we have as a school can be help the larger need for understanding in our world.

As of now each of the five days of the week will have particular theme: Monday will focus on the entire student body creating 1000 origami cranes. Japanese legend says that creating 1000 cranes allows the creator to be granted a wish. All our students will be folding the paper cranes or making feathers to go with them. On whichever item they make the students will be asked to write their goal (wish) they have for the year. Tuesday students will discuss ways to make the school bully-proof. Wednesday will be communication day. How do we improve our interpersonal communication so that messages we give are better understood by the recipient. Thursday will focus on personal heritage. We will ask students to create a flag or flags of nations from which then can trace their heritage. These will then be put up around the school on a continuing band of showing from where we have all come to where we are today. Whether a student traces their heritage from the United States or from the far reaches of Asia or anywhere else they will be able to proudly show this to their schoolmates. In addition we will be installing a massive world map in the main hall on which we will be able to pinpoint the parts of the world from which our students trace their heritage. The week will end on Friday with foods of nations on the table in each level. Cassie, Natalie and Stacy have been doing a lot of organizing to pull this week of community building together early in the year so that its effect can be felt all year. A big part of our community is how we as a group improve our academic performance. I got a call this morning from *The Boston Globe* asking what was it that gave SSCPS the most improved MCAS scores on the South Shore. In an article that is scheduled to be run in Sunday's edition, I spoke to the reporter about our improved math curriculum: Singapore Math and what that has meant. And also I talked about how after a huge influx of new students the year we moved to Norwell, our teachers had been able to assess the needs of the students and focused on the skills necessary for all our students to improve in math and language arts. There is no question that the time, skill and effort of our teachers to help our students learn the basics and deeper understanding of our curriculum has an impact on every one of our students. We are grateful for this MCAS evidence of our work but we also look forward to continued improvement in coming years.

As a community, there is no question we are strong and getting stronger and our work with your children supports their growth.

NEWS FROM THE ART DEPARTMENT

PRINCIPAL'S UPDATE

We received our MCAS and AYP report for 2005-2006 school year. Our results for this year were positive. We saw that our English Language Arts scores are still strong and that our Math scores have improved. It appears that our Singapore program is beginning to have a small, but noticeable effect. We knew when we began the new Math program that it would be a few years before we saw significant improvement. It was gratifying to see that improvement has begun. As always, there is room for improvement and the faculty will begin the process of combing through the information to find ways to help our students to achieve even more success.

If you have been following the school's soccer team, you already know that the team is undefeated (3-0) this young season. Congratulations to the players and Will Glennon, their coach, on a great start to the season. Thanks also to the parents who have come out to support the team. Next week the faculty will be continuing their professional development on differentiated instruction on Friday, October 6. This will be the second of three days that the faculty will be spending on this topic during the year. This is an effort to continue to provide the best possible instruction to our diverse community of learners.
