Tutoring Policy

Maintaining a high quality instructional level and providing a rich, varied curriculum should minimize the need for individual tutoring. Every effort should be made by the principal and teacher(s) to help the student with educational problems before recommending that parent(s) engage a fee-based tutor.

In order to cover exceptional cases where the school may recommend individual tutoring or individual tutoring may be requested by the student's parents, rules and regulations shall be established by the Head of School to protect both South Shore Charter Public School and teacher(s) from charges of conflict of interest.

RULES

- 1. Prior to beginning tutoring-for-a-fee of SSCPS students a teacher must discuss it with the principal to ascertain the appropriateness of the tutoring.
- 2. A teacher may not receive compensation for tutoring any student while that student is assigned to one of his/her classes.
- 3. Individual tutoring for compensation by SSCPS teachers shall not take place at anytime during the school day (7:45 AM-3:45 PM).
- 4. Music and art teachers may give private lessons to his/her own student(s) outside of the school's curriculum, but not during the school day.
- 5. SSCPS teachers who receive compensation for tutoring may use the school's facilities for such purpose before 7:45 AM and after 3:45 PM.
- 6. Parents shall be advised that individual tutoring shall not ordinarily provide credit. Any remediation for school year course failure must have written approval of the Principal prior to the tutoring commencing.
- 7. The Head of School is authorized to develop procedures to implement this policy.
