IMPORTANT DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

The Norwell Police have visited the school during dismissal time and have brought some safety concerns to our attention. In order to make student pick up as safe as possible for all students it is important that the following rules are adhered to by all parents/guardians:

Students are not allowed to leave our property at dismissal time to walk to parents parked down the street. Students will no longer be allowed to leave our property to meet you down the street or on other properties in the office park. You will need to come onto our property to pick up your students.

You must pick up your students or car pool by pulling into the school and picking up students at the front or back entrances. Please remember that those of you from towns beginning with A-M use the front door and towns beginning with N-Z use the rear door.

Parents are not allowed to park and pick up students along Longwater Circle where the buses and school vans pick up students. This space is earmarked for buses and school vans only. Do not ask your children to wait on the grass along Longwater Circle. They will no longer be able to wait there.

Parents are not allowed to park on any other property in the office park other than our property.

Parents must be considerate of others and our neighbors. Please do not block other business's driveways.

Please do not cut or pull in front of other parents waiting in line for pickup. Keep the front of the building clear for emergency vehicles. The first car in the front entrance of the building should stop at the beginning of the sidewalk on the far right side. This is the first car. Do not pull in front of this car and park along the front of the buildings entrance and along the right side of the road leading out of the entrance.

Please refrain from using cell phones. The use of cell phones during pickup is a distraction that could lead to accidents.

The speed limit for all vehicles on our property is 5 miles per hour. On Longwater Circle it is 20 miles per hour. Please respect these speed limits.

If you need to plan a meeting at the school, it is best to schedule these meetings after 3:15. This will allow for parking to be freed up for you to park during your meeting.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

In case your students may have been wondering why the Norwell Police Department has been visiting the school, it is part of a plan to have all of the officers from NPD tour each school to become familiar with its layout in the event of an emergency. Because of the schedules that the officers keep, we could get visits at any time from early morning until early evening. Please assure the students that the Police Department is touring our school to get to know the school, and if there were ever any emergency they would know where to go to be of the best assistance.

It has been an increasing concern of ours that students are not being picked up until after 3:30 in the afternoon. We cannot have students in the building unless they are under the direct supervision of a staff member in a particular activity. After 3:30 our staff is engaged in meetings and preparation time and is not available to supervise students. Please make arrangements to have you child picked up by 3:30 PM. Thank you for your cooperation.

If you need to speak with a faculty member about your child, please make an appointment to speak with that teacher. It is very difficult for faculty to hold impromptu conversations about students in the halls. The faculty has many commitments during the day to teach classes and proctor activities. We have asked all staff to not discuss confidential issues relating to students in public areas and that if parents wish to speak about their child an appointment should be made. In this way the proper care and attention can be made to the parents' concerns.

The National Honor Society Induction was held on Tuesday, November 7 in the High School Village Green. We have 8 inductees this year! Congratulations to these students. It is a wonderful recognition of all their hard work and dedication to the school.

Thanks to Bev Bruce and the Library Committee for arranging the book fair for this week.. Please stop by and purchase something for your children's library. All proceeds go to procuring more titles for the school library.
