IMPORTANT DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

The Norwell Police have visited the school during dismissal time and have brought some safety concerns to our attention. In order to make student pick up as safe as possible for all students it is important that the following rules are adhered to by all parents/guardians:

Students are not allowed to leave our property at dismissal time to walk to parents parked down the street. Students will no longer be allowed to leave our property to meet you down the street or on other properties in the office park. You will need to come onto our property to pick up your students.

You must pick up your students or car pool by pulling into the school and picking up students at the front or back entrances. Please remember that those of you from towns beginning with A-M use the front door and towns beginning with N-Z use the rear door.

Parents are not allowed to park and pick up students along Longwater Circle where the buses and school vans pick up students. This space is earmarked for buses and school vans only. Do not ask your children to wait on the grass along Longwater Circle. They will no longer be able to wait there.

Parents are not allowed to park on any other property in the office park other than our property.

Parents must be considerate of others and our neighbors. Please do not block other business's driveways.

Please do not cut or pull in front of other parents waiting in line for pickup. Keep the front of the building clear for emergency vehicles. The first car in the front entrance of the building should stop at the beginning of

the sidewalk on the far right side. This is the first car. Do not pull in front of this car and park along the front of the buildings entrance and along the right side of the road leading out of the entrance.

Please refrain from using cell phones. The use of cell phones during pickup is a distraction that could lead to accidents.

The speed limit for all vehicles on our property is 5 miles per hour. On Longwater Circle it is 20 miles per hour. Please respect these speed limits.

If you need to plan a meeting at the school, it is best to schedule these meetings after 3:15. This will allow for parking to be freed up for you to park during your meeting.

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

There have been several cases of Head Lice reported to the Health Office over the past few weeks. This has affected all levels. This week there were a few new cases reported. It is strongly recommended that parents be checking their children, siblings and family members everyday. Remind your children not to share personal articles and to avoid close contract with other students. All students with long hair should wear it up and pulled back at all times. Notify the Health Office of any new cases found.

Some facts regarding Head Lice:

- A lice infestation can happen to anyone. Socioeconomic background or lack of cleanliness has nothing to do with determining who gets lice.
- Lice are insects. They are an easily treatable condition that can be eliminated once they are discovered.
- You can prevent your child from getting lice. Lice do not jump or fly. They crawl. Tell your child not to share combs, hats or other clothing.
- **Don't be embarrassed if you child is sent home because of lice.** Between 8 and 12 million children get lice each year.
- **Know the symptoms of a lice infestation**. If your child is constantly itching, check the scalp for lice or eggs. The eggs will appear as white specks stuck to the hair near the scalp.
- **Do not send your child to school if you suspect lice**. Check with your school nurse for proper instruction on how to treat a lice infestation.
