

FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

We are making a few changes in staff and procedures in December. The School has been mindful of all the attention in recent years about the safety of students at school. Despite all our best intentions as a society we appear to be drifting towards greater and greater caution regarding schools and their activities. While we have no intention of banning the students from playing "tag" at recess as some other schools have seen need to, we want to make our environment as safe as possible. Even though we are an adult intensive community with about one adult for every eight students, we have come to feel that we need some added precautions on campus. Thus it is that during vacation week we are having several security measures installed in the building. This installation will include surveillance cameras at all the doors, the computer lab and the middle hallway and a buzzer at the front door. There will also be a camera on both the front and back of the building monitoring the parking lots and playground.

The buzzer will be the most noticeable change. After 8:15 AM arrival all exterior doors will be locked. All entries to the building will need to come through the front door. To enter, one will need to ring the buzzer and wait for the receptionist to let them in.

While these measures appear necessary there is a note of wistfulness attached to the whole change. One of the great things about our school has been the easy accessibility of parents and friends to the building. While all are still welcome to come, the buzzer puts a note of recognition of the world we live in today between the school and our community; we regret this. We ask for your support of these installations and before long we will probably see them as just a regular part of life here at SSCPS as they are at many schools today.

In addition, when we return from vacation, there will be a new face at the front desk in the afternoons. We are in the process of hiring a part-time receptionist to aid the administrative support staff. The school has been operating with the same administrative support staff it did in Hull three years ago when the school enrollment was 33% smaller than it is today. This added person will alleviate some of the workload that the staff has taken on with more students, staff and parents. Also, Dr. Gorsuch and Mariclare have moved their offices to the Level Two part of the building. This will also give greater administrative presence in that part of the building and be helpful in the supervision of activities there.
