Tom, Ted, Pam, Kristine, and Bob Jesus, Director of Technology, and I have been working with a web-design company to redo our web-site. A grant from the Foundation funds the start-up costs for this on-going project. One of the "assignments" from the company was for us to come up with three key words and a theme/symbol for the school logo on the web-page. We began working on this task in mid-December and on January 3rd, we reached consensus: the three words that should be included in the logo are independence, knowledge and community and that the logo would be the tree of knowledge.

In this update, I wanted to focus upon **community** and why we selected it as one of the three words for the new logo. From the day that the school opened its doors in Hull in 1995 to today, community has always been an integral part of SSCPS. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Thank you to Kassandra Grant for arranging for Level I and the Dance Project students from Level II to see the University Dancers (from UMASS Amherst) perform on today's field trip to Hingham High School. The students are fortunate to have the opportunity to see this.

High school midyear exams are this week, today through Friday. Today's exams are blocks A & B, Thursday's are C & D, and Friday's are E & make-ups. Attendance will be taken during advisory at 8:15 AM. Students will then proceed to morning meeting and then to their appropriate classroom for the first exam.
