## A great place to visit . . .

This month, a number of educators have visited SSCPS to observe our teachers in action. Our first guests were from Weymouth who is considering replacing their Everyday Math program with Singapore Math. Angie Pepin coordinated the visit. The middle school math coach and the other teachers were most impressed with the program, our teachers and, most importantly, how engaged the students were with the math problems!

Three curriculum writers and developers from Core Knowledge spent two days sitting in on phonics and reading lessons in Level 1 and meeting with the teachers to discuss the new programs. Our guests raved about our teachers and have asked if they can come back again later in the spring and bring more people so that they can observe outstanding reading instruction in action.

Last week, former Executive Director Ed Gotgart and two teachers from St. Johns School in Wellesley visited with teachers in Levels II and III and observed our multiage model. St. Johns is looking at different instructional models and, again, we received positive feedback from the teachers about our students and teachers.

## Parents wanted to meet with our next visitors - the Department of Education . . .

Once again this year, a team from the Charter School Office in the Department of Education will be visiting our school. Next Tuesday, February 5, a four person team will spend the day sitting in on classes and meeting with members of the Board of Trustees, administrators, faculty, parents, and students. They have asked us to put together a schedule for them. We have blocked out an hour, from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. for the parent meeting. We would like to have the DOE team hear from as many parents as possible during that hour so that the DOE can hear from our parents about our academic program and get the parents' perspective.
