Special thanks to the parents who were able to attend the DOE focus group meeting yesterday morning. We appreciate their taking time out of their busy work schedules to meet with the five member team and respond to questions about SSCPS and how the school meets the academic and social needs of their sons and daughters.

The Team was impressed by the great turn-out of parents and members of the Board of Trustees for their focus group meetings and the DOE noted that there was a nice cross section in each group– parents from all grade levels and different communities as well as new and veteran members of the BOT. Of course, our grade three through twelve students in their focus group were eloquent and had no difficulty forthrightly answering any of the questions posed to them.

At the end of the day, the two Team chairs met with the Leadership Team for a ten minute exit interview. According to Tom and Ted, the feedback that we received was the most positive of all of their recent exit interviews with the DOE. In fact, several members were so impressed by our Singapore Math Program and the projects that they asked if they could come back another time for a professional day to learn more about what we do to share with teachers in their charter schools! This is true dissemination --- and as a result of a site visit!

Clearly, SSCPS is a great place and, as more and more people learn about us, the more they want to enroll their students here. The deadline for applications is today, February 6. Although we know there will be more applications coming in today, we know that we will have more applications this year than last.
