Last Thursday was the first meeting of our environmental/go green committee. Although it was a busy night for many, there were twelve in attendance including two students (third and fifth grade). In addition to those twelve, ten staff members and parents contacted me to indicate their interest in serving on the committee although they were unable to attend the meeting. As of today, we have twenty-five members and we are still growing.

Those at the first meeting agreed that there would be **four subcommittees**: Wellness; Curriculum, Workshops and Projects; Renewable Energy/Conservation/Healthy Building; and Outreach and Advocacy. We also agreed that we wanted to get more students involved in our committee and that one way to do this would be to have a school-wide competition to come up with unique/engaging name for the committee. In addition to these decisions, Tara Turner, high school science teacher, and Cheryl Casey, parent, agreed to meet this week to investigate ways that SSCPS can be involved with Earth Day in April or early May. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I would like to take this opportunity to share a few things that the school has done and will do during this school year to improve school safety and climate. During this year we have taken steps to introduce programs and initiate new ones to assist our students and families. Earlier this year we invited Dr. Elizabeth Englander to our school to address parent on bullying and we are in discussion with Dr. Englander to schedule next year's teacher and student training to continue developing a culture in which bullying is not tolerated. We also had Attorneys Mary Lee and Mark Dunderdale from the Plymouth County District Attorneys' Office make presentations to parent, staff, and students about Internet safety. Recently we have received a grant from the Plymouth County DA's Office to conduct a school safety survey. This will enable us to assess our students and their needs in regarding any dangerous or risky behaviors in which they may be participating or encountering. From this data we will be able to better plan future programs and apply for grants to support these programs.

Please know that we are committed to provide the highest quality educational experience in a safe and welcoming environment. If you ever feel there are issues related to student safety, in regards to a civil rights issue please feel free to contact Dan Falkner. He is our Civil Rights Officer and as such is responsible to investigating issues related to harassment or other violations of a student or staff member's civil rights. SEPAC WORKSHOP - Sensory Integration - Thursday, March 27th from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm will be presented by **Kathleen Donovan, OTR/L** who has been working as an occupational therapist for almost 10 years and has worked in a variety of settings including adults with developmental disabilities, early intervention, the Children's Developmental Disability Center, and now in the school systems. In each of these settings, she has used sensory integration techniques and activities to improve function and assist with developmental growth and have seen fabulous results! Sensory Integration (SI) is how the body takes in, processes, interprets, and responds to internal and external stimuli. It affects all aspects of our day and simple strategies can improve emotional responses as well as participation and attention!!
