SEPAC WORKSHOP - Sensory Integration - Thursday, March 27th from 7:00 pm to 9:00 pm will be presented by Kathleen Donovan, OTR/L who has been working as an occupational therapist for almost 10 years and has worked in a variety of settings including adults with developmental disabilities, early intervention, the Children's Developmental Disability Center, and now in the school systems. In each of these settings, she has used sensory integration techniques and activities to improve function and assist with developmental growth and have seen fabulous results! Sensory Integration (SI) is how the body takes in, processes, interprets, and responds to internal and external stimuli. It affects all aspects of our day and simple strategies can improve emotional responses as well as participation and attention!! These strategies can be used throughout the day or at certain times that may be challenging, such as homework!!
