Spring and MCAS testing . . .

Spring is in the air and it is once again time for our students in grades 3 through 10 to take the state mandated MCAS assessments. March is the month that the English/ Language Arts tests are administered to students in grades 3-8 and 10. MCAS testing across the Commonwealth resumes the week of May 12th. The subjects tested in May are math, history/social studies and science. The science MCAS tests for students in grades 9 and 10 will be administered on June 4 and 5. Kudos to the teachers, support staff and school administrators for all of their efforts to create an optimum testing environment for our students in a building that does not have much, if any, extra space for small group testing.

We also greatly appreciate all of the support, guidance and encouragement that our parents give to their sons & daughters on the MCAS days. Research shows that we all do better at work and on high stakes tests if we have a good night of sleep and a healthy breakfast. It is also important to remember that the MCAS assessments provide us with a snapshot of student performance in the tested subject areas and are just one indicator of a student's mastery and understanding of those subjects.

Upcoming events

With the onset of spring and, hopefully, sunnier and warmer weather, everyone is looking forward to spending more time outdoors and getting more exercise. At the end of this week, packets are going out to all families for our 2nd Annual Walk-A-Thon which is scheduled for Thursday, May 8th. From all accounts, last year's walk-a-thon was a resounding success. Those funds went directly to the school and were used to help pay for the completion of our new science lab and Level 1 classroom as well as the installation of playground turf. This year, funds raised from the Walk-A-Thon will be earmarked to help SSCPS become a greener community, purchase Apple MAC computers for the art room, beautify our building and grounds, provide additional professional development for our staff, and maintain our current curriculum in art, music, foreign languages, and environmental workshops. SSCPS is committed to the providing our students with a comprehensive education that includes the arts, music, and environmental science. In so many of our sending communities, there have been cutbacks in these areas as well as foreign language instruction. On behalf of all of us at SSCPS, we thank you for sending your children to our school and supporting our Annual Fund, Walk-A-Thon, Auction, and other events. Parent involvement is essential to the success of our school.

Behavior Workshop on Challenging Behavior with Children - By Dr. Bob Ross - on Thursday, April 10, 2008 at 12:15 pm. This workshop will immediately follow early release and will be held at the school and is open to all parents. Dr. Bob Ross who is from Beacon Services will be presenting this workshop. A description of this workshop is the following:

Title: Top Ten List: Functional Advice To Give Parents Regarding Problem Behavior At Home.

This workshop will identify and discuss specific strategies that can be given to/taught to parents to aid them in managing and decreasing the occurrence of challenging behavior at home and in the community. The training is set up like a David Letterman "Top Ten" list (although I count up rather than down). The workshop is designed to be interactive and there are opportunities for parents to ask questions about specific problems they encounter at home.

Proposed Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will be able to describe specific responses to problem behavior that often fail to help decrease problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to identify the variables that most often contribute to the occurrence of problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to list alternative ways of responding to problem behavior in order to decrease its occurrence.
