**Behavior Workshop on Challenging Behavior with Children - By Dr. Bob Ross -** on Thursday, April 10, 2008 at 12:15 pm. This workshop will immediately follow early release and will be held at the school and is open to all parents. Dr. Bob Ross who is from Beacon Services will be presenting this workshop. A description of this workshop is the following:

Title: Top Ten List: Functional Advice To Give Parents Regarding Problem Behavior At Home.

This workshop will identify and discuss specific strategies that can be given to/taught to parents to aid them in managing and decreasing the occurrence of challenging behavior at home and in the community. The training is set up like a David Letterman "Top Ten" list (although I count up rather than down). The workshop is designed to be interactive and there are opportunities for parents to ask questions about specific problems they encounter at home.

Proposed Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will be able to describe specific responses to problem behavior that often fail to help decrease problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to identify the variables that most often contribute to the occurrence of problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to list alternative ways of responding to problem behavior in order to decrease its occurrence.

#### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

We are pleased to announce that we have received a \$500 grant from the Plymouth County District Attorney's Office to help us conduct a Communities That Care Survey. This survey asks our students about their participation in or experience of smoking and other tobacco product use, drug and alcohol abuse, and violence related behaviors including weapons possession. This information will assist us in applying for new health and wellness programs and, possibly, equipment and facilities. We will be conducting this survey next week with students in grades 6-12 only. The results of the survey should be returned to us in late April and we will provide a report sometime in May. We would like to thank Judy Kaplan for all her work on this project and interfacing with the Plymouth County DA's Office to secure the grant.

MCAS English Language Arts exams finish this week. Results of these exams will be available over the summer. Thanks to the teachers and parents for getting the students ready for these important exams. The Math, Science, and Social Studies will be administered in May and early June.
