## Thursday, April 10 -- Early Release Day, $2^{\text {nd }}$ Eco-Committee Meeting, and Parent Program on Students with Learning Disabilities

A reminder that this Thursday is an early release day. After dismissal at 12:00 p.m. our teachers and staff will be involved in a number of professional development activities. There are also two special events planned that all parents are invited to attend. At 12:30 p.m. in room 106 the Eco-Committee will be meeting to discuss going green, SSCPS Earth Day plans, landscaping around the school (including building a memorial garden), environmental studies, and long-term school renovation plans. Over the weekend, I sent an email invitation to the chairs and co-chairs of our fundraising events to this Saturday's summit on current and future fundraising at SSCPS. ## After School Programs, Extra-help, and Supervision

Over the past several weeks, the number of students being picked up after 3:00 p.m. (dismissal time) has increased dramatically. Faculty, staff and visitors to our school after hours have voiced their concern about the large number of students, of all ages, waiting in the front lobby. The lobby is crowded, the noise level makes it difficult to conduct business, and some students become rambunctious. While we recognize that there will be occasions when parents will be legitimately delayed, we simply are not equipped to handle consistent late pick-ups. I have asked Tom and Ted to discuss the after-school issues at the next School Council meeting and to consider proposing a late fee charge, something that other Massachusetts charter schools do. In the meantime, despite our very tight budget, we have extended the work day for one of our Level IV paraprofessionals, Amanda Duante. Amanda will be supervising students from 3:15 p.m. to 4:15 p.m. in Level IV Room 201. Students will be expected to read or do homework under Amanda’s supervision until their parent/ride picks them up.

Behavior Workshop on Challenging Behavior with Children - By Dr. Bob Ross - on Thursday, April 10, 2008 at 12:15 pm. This workshop will immediately follow early release and will be held at the school and is open to all parents. Dr. Bob Ross who is from Beacon Services will be presenting this workshop.
A description of this workshop is the following: Title: Top Ten List: Functional Advice To Give Parents Regarding Problem Behavior At Home. This workshop will identify and discuss specific strategies that can be given to/taught to parents to aid them in managing and decreasing the occurrence of challenging behavior at home and in the community. The training is set up like a David Letterman "Top Ten" list (although I count up rather than down). The workshop is designed to be interactive and there are opportunities for parents to ask questions about specific problems they encounter at home.
Proposed Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will be able to describe specific responses to problem behavior that often fail to help decrease problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to identify the variables that most often contribute to the occurrence of problem behavior.
- Participants will be able to list alternative ways of responding to problem behavior in order to decrease its occurrence.
