MCAS Testing

It's that time again – MCAS testing. In recent Updates and letters from the Level Coordinators and teachers, there have been announcements about the specific dates and tests for each grade. The last MCAS tests (high school science) will be administered on June 3 and June 4. Over the course of the year, our teachers have been working with our students in all of the tested subject areas to prepare them for these important state-wide assessments. In addition to working with their students on the important content and skills that will be assessed, teachers have been coaching them on test taking strategies. At the same time, they have been doing everything that they can to reduce students' test anxiety. As always, parents are so important in instilling confidence and the right attitude toward learning at home. We would greatly appreciate it if you would make certain that your student has a good night's sleep before the MCAS tests and a healthy breakfast in the morning.
