Inspiring students Kindergarten to grade twelve to excel in academics, the arts, career, and life

Dear Parents and Guardians of K – Sixth Graders,

One of the hallmarks of our school has always been that parents and guardians are involved in directly requesting which teacher their child will have. This has been our tradition in large part because this was a school founded by parents and we as educators believe that you know your children better than anyone. In this letter I want to make sure that everyone understands how the process of teacher requests works and how we weigh those requests.

We begin organizing next year's classes in May. The first step we make is to keep every student who is returning to a level in the same class. The assumption is that in most cases a child will be best served working with their current teacher or if the teacher is leaving with their current classmates. There will be times when we will want to move a child to a different classroom because we believe that new classroom will be a better fit for that child. In that case the level coordinator or I will contact you. From the list of returning students we try to weigh the needs of balancing the boys and girls in a classroom, the mix of learning styles, and the number of students of the various grades. It will help us greatly if your child is changing levels for you to write us a description of what type of classroom you feel will be the most beneficial for your child. In that request you may specify a particular teacher but the most important part of the letter is a description of what type of learning environment is best for your child. We think carefully about class placement and we share the lists with colleagues to try to construct successful classrooms.

From there we will have an idea of how many openings there will be for any given class and the first but not the only way we fill those spots is by looking at the parent description letter. We do not guarantee that we will be able to honor every request but I will let you know in June if we have not been able to fulfill your request.

Please make your request to me preferably in the form of an e-mail at <u>thirsch@sscps.org</u> or if you do not have e-mail on a standard full sheet of paper enclosed in an envelope. It will help us in setting up effective classrooms if we could have this request by June 6, 2008. In your request it would also help us if you could briefly explain the reason for your request.
