### **GREETINGS, MEMBERS OF THE SSCPS COMMUNITY!**

2007-2008 is a very special school year for us since four members of the Class of 2008 started as kindergarteners in September, 1995. These four students, along with four staff members, Velma Begley, Claudia Darrow, Rick Small, and Ted Hirsh have been part of South Shore Charter Public School's thirteen year evolution and journey from Hull to Norwell.

The week of August 27<sup>th</sup> was the "official" opening of school for students and staff. Monday was Staff Orientation Day, Tuesday was Freshman and New Student Orientation Day, and everyone returned on Wednesday. As I greeted staff, students and their families each day, I could sense everyone's excitement, enthusiasm and high hopes for the year.

There were smiles all around as students and families toured the building and observed the changes made over the summer. The new level 1 classroom is spacious and well furnished and the science lab is state-of-the-art. Kudos to our crackerjack maintenance crew, Paul and Gabe, and the contractors as well as the staff for their work and extra efforts over the summer so that we would be ready to open on August 28<sup>th</sup>! We are planning an "open house" before the October 18th Board of Trustees meeting to show off these two new classrooms. We hope that you will be able to join us at 6:30 p.m. on that evening.

In addition to the renovations, five media carts, complete with an LCD projector, lap-top computer, and a DVD/video tape recorder, have been purchased for teachers to enhance their lessons. All of these changes will help us achieve our mission to "inspire students in kindergarten through grade twelve *to excel* in academics, career and life."

Of course, to accomplish our mission, we rely on the *triangle of support* "that includes teachers, parents and the student in a unified approach to fostering each student's growth." As your new Executive Director, I have quickly learned that what makes South Shore Charter School so special is the dedication of the teachers. Over the summer, Tom, Ted, Ron, and Kristine have been very busy interviewing candidates for teaching positions. Nothing is more important than hiring high quality teachers who will be the right fit for our school.

To promote collaboration, consistency and communication, Tom and Ted earmarked most of this year's professional development budget for all teachers to take a six day course together, "Studying Skillful Teaching". This course is being taught by Laura Porter from Research for Better Teaching. The first two days of the course were Thursday, August 23 and Friday, August 24. Tom, Ted and I are taking the course as well. In addition to learning some new teaching strategies, an added bonus to the two day training was our new staff having the opportunity to get to know the "seasoned" staff better and learn more about the culture of SSCPS.

This year, we welcome eight new classroom teachers, two special education teachers, and four paraprofessionals to the SSCPS family: Kassandra Grant and Elise Lovejoy, Level I; Kristin Swanson, Level II; David Corbett, Level III; Kaitlyn Walsh and Richard Merget, Level IV, Lora DeSalvo, high school U.S. History and World Cultures and Pamela Habib, high school Math; Elizabeth Martello, Learning Services, Level II; and Joyce Dandrow, Learning Services, Level III. When you have the time, take a look at the bulletin board in the main foyer to view candid photos of our great staff!

Over the course of this school year, there will be a number of celebrations and reunions to commemorate the achievements of the Class of 2008 as well as our charter school over the past thirteen years. The dates and times of these spring activities will be announced shortly.

Together, we can make this a year full of new learning experiences, academic achievement and personal engagement for our students.

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

**-- PUBLIC HEARING FOR PROPOSED CHARTER SCHOOL LEGISLATION --**

The following is an important e-mail message from Marc Kenen, Executive Director of the Massachusetts Charter Public School Association:

“On Tuesday, September 25th the K-12 Education Committee of the Legislature will hold a public hearing in Gardner Auditorium in the State House on proposed Charter School Legislation.

We understand that the Superintendent's Association will be pushing hard their proposal to limit district funding for charters to \$5,000 per student so it's very important that we have a large turnout of parents and supporters. Testimony on our proposed legislation to raise the 9% district cap on charters will also be heard that day.

As in the past, we are able to reimburse you for transportation for parents to the state house. The hearing will begin at 1:00. We're asking everyone to stay at least until 2:00, later if you can. We also encourage you to come early and visit with your local reps and senators before the hearing starts. Let me know if you need help setting up appointments."

It is very important that we have a large turnout of parents to attend the hearing and show their support for charter schools. I am coordinating car pools. I am willing to reserve a bus if we have enough of an interest. Some folks might work downtown and plan on attending the hearing. I am open to any suggestions. **COMMUNITY SERVICE OPPORTUNITY FOR SEPTEMBER** - Our first community service activity of the year will be participating in Coast Sweep again. It will be taking place on Saturday, September 15th, from 9-11 a.m. We will be meeting at the bathhouse on Nantasket Ave. and Nancy Kramer, our local coordinator, will have all the supplies we need (data cards, pencils, trash bags, disposable gloves).

This year marks the 20th anniversary of Coast Sweep and SSCPS has been a part of this effort for many years, beginning when we were located right on the beaches of Hull. It is sponsored locally by Coastal Zone Management and Urban Harbors Institute at UMass, Boston, but Coast Sweep is an international campaign organized by the Ocean Conservancy in Washington, D.C. Volunteers clean coasts of oceans, rivers, and lakes, while recording data on this marine debris. The information gathered is used to help reduce future marine debris problems. Last year 358, 617 volunteers in 68 countries removed 7 million pounds of debris from the oceans, rivers, and lakes of the world! And SSCPS was 35 of those volunteers! 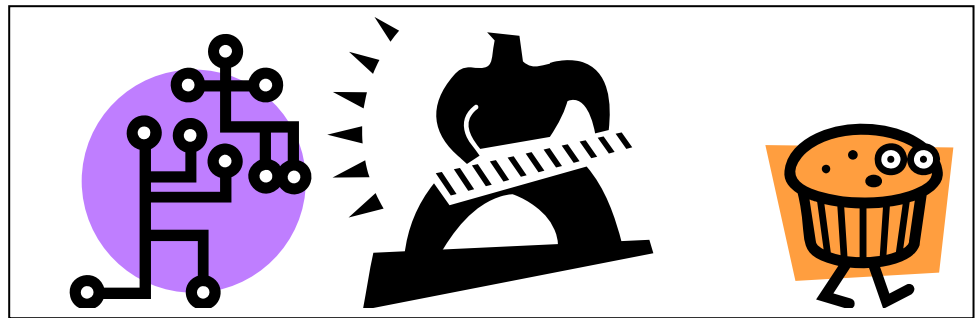
