PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Thanks again to everyone who participated in the High school parent/teacher conference night and the presentations on Senior Projects last Thursday, October 11. Thanks also to Shelley, Krista, Angie, and Ted for their Singapore Math night on Tuesday, October 16. It was a great turnout and well received. It is gratifying to know so many of our parents take a keen interest in this new curriculum.

A continued request from Tara...the forensics team will start competing in a few weeks. They need to bring 2-3 judges with them each meet or pay a penalty. You can serve as a judge for speech, acting, or debate. The meets are on Saturday mornings from 9-12. There are 1 or 2 meets a month. You can sign up to judge at 1 or several meets. MCAS scores are being sent home to parents this week. While we have made some progress, we have a way to go. The faculty continues to study these results to determine the best course of action to help all of our students to become proficient and life long learners.
