## SSCPS - A Place Where Learning Comes Alive!

Another action packed week at SSCPS. First, we received some wonderful news in the mail from the Massachusetts Department of Education. Ten members of the Class of 2008 have qualified for the Abigail Adams Scholarships based upon their MCAS scores. There are few schools in the Commonwealth that have $28 \%$ of their graduating seniors qualifying for the 4 year full-scholarships at Massachusetts public colleges and universities! Congratulations to Daniel Alexandre, Kelly Barber, Keith Barry, Stephen Barton, James Beggan, Robert Bowker-Kelly, Joseph Demore, Emily Doolittle, Pat Landis, Samantha Wholley. All of us at SSCPS are so proud of your accomplishments.

Next week, on Wednesday, November 14 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, SSCPS will be inducting students into the National Honor Society. Parents are invited to join the faculty and staff at this important ceremony. To be inducted students must met GPA requirements, leadership and community service standards. The program begins at 1:30pm in the High School great room.

Thanks to Ted and Level I, II \& III staff for showing off our school on Thursday to teachers from the Park Street School in Boston. They are using the Core Knowledge Curriculum and wanted to spend some time observing and talking with our teachers. Of course, they left impressed by all that we do.

Thank you all for helping us prepare our school for the Open House, thanks to those who found the time on Saturday to join us so that we could tell our story to potential students and their families. Bev Bruce sent me a lovely email sharing some of the positive feedback from families that toured our building.

Thank you to Bev Bruce and the library committee for the wonderful Book Fair. It was very evident how excited our students were about the book selections and purchasing as many as their family and budget could afford. I plan to put in my order for the two grandkids today.

Yesterday morning, we had central office staff from Holbrook, Randolph, Rockland and Weymouth meet with Ted, Tom and me to discuss our changing populations and professional development needs. It was a very productive first meeting and we plan to meet again on Monday, December 10 - same time, same place."

## Open House

Despite the windy and rainy weather on Saturday, 74 potential students and their parents attended our first Open House. We greatly appreciated all of the teachers, parents, students, and administrators who participated in the tours, answered questions about our programs, and welcomed potential new students. Although we are only two plus months into the new school year, our recruiting process for new students has begun. The best ambassadors for our school are our student and their parents. Please continue to spread the good news about SSCPS and let families interested in learning more about our school know that our next Open House is Tuesday, January 15 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Of course, families can always contact me or any member of the SSCPS staff to learn more about our school.

## CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

This afternoon, at 4:00 p.m. there is a joint meeting of the Development and Facilities Subcommittees. The purpose of the meeting is to review the blueprints for the final phase of the build out of our facility, the cost estimate for completion and determine how the two subcommittees will work together on our $\$ 3$ million capital campaign. As always, our meetings are posted and open to all. Over the weeks and months ahead, you will be hearing more about our campaign and how you can help us achieve our goal.

## November Board Meeting

The Board of Trustees will be meeting on Thursday, November $15^{\text {th }}$. All Board meetings are open to parents, students and the public. The agenda items for the meeting include a presentation by Level III students on their school store and how they have implemented our new Wellness program; an overview of the school's Safety and Security protocol including our new Immediate Crisis Response book; and a proposed changed to our student parking policy. Most of the meeting, however, will be focused upon the recent MCAS results. Tom Gorsuch and Ted Hirsch will present their MCAS analysis, describe their work with teachers on how to use the software program TestWiz to interpret the data to make adjustments in curriculum, instruction and assessment practices, and share with the Board revisions to the 20072008 School Improvement Plan to improve student performance and instruction. We invite all of you to attend this important meeting.
