BULLYING PREVENTION PROGRAM INFORMATION

Thank you to those who participated in the on-line anti-bullying survey. With the assistance of MARC, the school will analyze and use your responses to develop programs and strategies that contribute to a safe and respectful learning environment

Dr. Elizabeth Englander, founder and director or the Massachusetts Aggression Reduction Center (MARC) will make her parent presentation on **Tuesday - December 11th at 9 a.m**. The presentation will last about 1 1\2 hours and will be held in the Music Room. Please enter through the front doors and sign-in at the front desk. Please look for parking at the school. If you cannot find a space, please park closest to the school (next door) at the Weichert Realty lot.

Dr. Englander will:

- define various types of bullying.
- provide tips to help parents recognize when their child is a victim of bullying and how parents can become active in preventing and resolving bullying situations.

- explain confidentiality laws what SSCPS staff can and cannot tell you and how these laws affect your right to know as a parent.
- address cell phone abuse, what social networking sites are, their dangers, how dangers can be avoided and talking to your teens about uses and abuses of these sites.

Child care will be provided on-site by SSCPS students from the Child Development Workshop. Children must be at least 6 months old, and parents are to provide all *peanut free snacks*, drinks, diapers/wipes, and toys for their own children. Space is limited. Pre-registration is required. "The Basics of Encouragement"

The workshop will focus on the "language of encouragement" and how important it is to find the right words to provide "in" couragement. Many children (and adults) engage in what Ron calls "catastrophic" thinking... They tend to ruminate and obsess making "mountains out of mole hills." They also tend to fall apart because they only see what they did wrong and they are blind to what they did "right.

For these individuals, positive, sloppy feedback doesn't work as an encouragement because it's too vague and/or they simply can not "accept" it. Thus, a conversation needs to be had with these children about this. As meaningful adults in their lives, we need to find ways to give them "believable" positive to specific feedback. The Adlerian Psychologists such as Rudolf Dreikurs, Don Dinkmeyer, etc. call this Encouragement. Please RSVP via separate email to Beth Toma JToma85103@aol.com you would like to attend.

This is an easy way for you to recycle your paper every week and help us raise money for projects/workshops.


What Can Be Placed in the Retriever Bin?

Concert attire: clothes that are neat and clean and have no writing or logos on them.


Hingham High School is at 17 Union Street


