SEPAC WORKSHOP - ADD/ADHD, THURSDAY, JANUARY 17, 2008 - 7:00 PM - 9:00 PM

ADD/ADHD an Overview - How do you know if a child you known has ADD? In this workshop, focus is on children with Attention Deficit Disorder. What it is, what it is not, with discussion including: symptoms, diagnosis, and intervention. Coping with struggles that arise in the home and in school are presented. Various treatments including: medication, behavioral, emotional and organizational skills are discussed.

Presenter: Alan Jacobson, Ph.D. - Outpatient Director of the Providence Center.

Alan Jacobson is a licensed psychologist and certified school psychologist whose experience includes consulting to area school and community groups for the past eight years.
