#### Building community, service to others, history in the making ...

This Monday, January 19<sup>th</sup>, communities across the country will come together for celebrations, church services, and special events in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King. While there are activities and events every year to recognize and acknowledge Dr. King's contributions to civil rights and our country, 2009 is a very special year. President-elect Obama and Vice-President–elect Biden have not only announced that their administration will be committed to service learning and reaching out to one's community, they have created a website, <u>www.usaservice.org</u>. They have called for a national day of service on January 19<sup>th</sup> to "Renew America Together."

The heading at the top of the USA*SERVICE web*-site reads, "We are one people, We are one nation; and together, we will begin the next great chapter in America's story". At this site, a powerful case is made for service learning and a continuation of programs begun during President Kennedy's administration. The information on the site changes daily and there are a number of video clips AND a LINK that will direct you to activities and service projects in our local area that are planned to honor Dr. King and service to others. In the Tuesday, January 13<sup>th</sup> entry, the heading was "The Business of Service" and reads:

"We find ourselves at a unique moment: America faces a crisis of historic proportions amid equally historic levels of enthusiasm to repair our world. Everyone wants to serve. The President-elect has promised to expand AmeriCorps and the Peace Corps and to channel the civic energies of the American public through new vehicles, such as an Education Corps or Green Jobs Corps. Supplementing these efforts, nonprofit organizations like CityYear, Teach for America, and YouthBuild seem poised to explode."

CityYear began right here in Boston and it has been replicated in cities all over the United States. Our own Angie Pepin is a "veteran" of Teach for America" – another wonderful program that began in the Northeast.

The news report today that December retail sales dropped 2.7% -- the worst holiday season since 1969, underscores the seriousness of our economic situation right now. The road ahead for all of us will not be easy, but our citizens have always been up to any challenge and I believe that we are at our best when we work together, sacrifice together, and look out for those less fortunate.

Tuesday, January 20<sup>th</sup> is another historic occasion: the inauguration of our first African-American president. At SSCPS, we have only one cable/broadband drop but we do have five LCD projection carts with computers. Our plan is to set them up in Great Room, Level meeting areas, and the Music Room/Auditorium. We are not certain that the feed from the internet will be reliable (millions of people will be watching via the internet) so our back-up plan is to have radios ready to go if need be (just like millions of Americans listening to FDR's Fireside Chats in the 1930s). Note: Our long-range plan for the building includes cable drops in all classrooms and HD televisions but it will be awhile before we can accomplish this goal.

**Cyberbullying Informational Meeting for parents of Level III and IV students on Thursday, January 15 from 7pm:** Current and valuable information concerning the problem of cyberbullying and internet abuse by middle grade students to be presented by Claire and Angie who recently attended a Massachusetts Aggression Reduction Center (MARC) Conference at Bridgewater State College. The meeting will cover age-appropriate limits on children's use of electronic communications, social networking guidelines (FaceBook, MySpace, etc.), and practical strategies for parents concerning cyberbullying, and confidentiality around cyberbullying issues.

#### 7-12 PRINCIPAL REPORT

Last week high school students and high school faculty began a discussion on improving our school climate. Students in Level IV have also been involved building community. Like any organization there are always areas of our program that could and should be improved. Working on improving the climate and building community in a school requires constant attention.

To begin our most recent discussion on climate, high school students were divided into six groups last Thursday. In student led discussions, the groups were asked their opinions on what they like about our school and what areas they would like to see changed or improved. The information coming from these group meetings was reported out at town meeting this Tuesday afternoon. One theme voiced by a number of students at Town Meeting was that as our school has grown there have been changes to the climate, that in some ways we may have loss the sense of community that once existed here.

It is true that our school has grown. It is also true that faculty and students are vested in continuing the work necessary to build community. We all value a culture of respect, and we all realize that the culture and the sense of community that permeates every aspect of our work here at SSCPS is part of what makes our school so special.

Next Thursday, January 22 at 7 PM, Level IV students will present to the Board of Trustees their efforts at building community. In the coming months, high school students and faculty will continue the work on improving school climate and building our school community.
