# Annual Fund Phone-a-Thon This Week

As you know by now, the Annual Fund is our most important fundraiser. The monies raised from your contributions DIRECTLY support our school. Each year, we COUNT on \$50,000 from our Educational Foundation and we include that amount in our OPERATING budget for the year. Most of the \$50,000 comes from the Annual Fund, the rest from our other fundraisers (Road Race, Golf Tournament/Auction, Touch-a-Truck, etc.). These funds have helped to make it possible for us to provide "extra" resources and materials for our teachers and to offer unique workshops and projects that include field trips in our vans. Last night, the media reported that Massachusetts tax revenues plummeted in April and that the state government will need to make more cuts in the budget for next year. Tonight and tomorrow evening, volunteers will be calling parents who have not yet contributed to our Annual Fund. Our goal is 100% participation of all parents and \$60,000 from all fundraising activities by June 30<sup>th</sup>. Please contribute as much as you can to the Annual Fund – we need to reach our goals so that we can continue to provide the wonderful programs and activities for our students next year.

Last month students sat down for the first round of the MCAS tests, writing the English Language Arts Long Composition and taking the session tests. It was impressive to see how serious our students tested across the levels. Faculty, staff, and parents are to be commended for all the work they did to prepare students and students are to be commended for giving their best efforts taking these tests.

Now, after a brief hiatus, students must prepare for the math and science sections of the tests. Beginning next week, students will sit for these exams. Parents and guardians should make sure their children are rested and ready for testing, a good night of sleep and a nourishing breakfast go a long way in helping students to focus on these tests. # Level I, II and III,



# AMENDMENT TO THE SSCPS BY-LAWS

The amendment recommended by the Governance Committee and approved by the Board of Trustee at their meeting on April 16, 2009, clarifies the wording of the Article dealing with Trustees' terms. The following is presented for affirmation.

# Article V 3-a "Terms"

### **Current Wording**

**VOTE FOR ONE (1) OF THE FOLLOWING:** 

The Terms of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive, staggered three-year terms. Exceptions may be granted by the Board.

# To be replaced by the following wording

"The terms of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive three (3) year terms for a maximum of nine (9) consecutive years. Shorter terms (1 or 2 years) may be served at the discretion of the Board."
