#### State Budget Woes and Ways to Help SSCPS Weather the Storm

First, thank you to the volunteers who made the phone calls to families last week for the Annual Fund. Unfortunately, we were not able to reach everyone so I plan to send out an **ALERT NOW** reminder later today about our need to raise a total of \$57,000 by June 30<sup>th</sup>. At this time, we have raised approximately \$31,000 from ALL of our fundraising activities. The very good news on the parent participation in the Annual Fund is that we are ahead of last year already: 44% of our parents have donated to the fund. Let's get to 70% -- we can do it.

#### Second Annual Touch-a-Truck, Sunday, May 17th

This Sunday, families from the South Shore will be going to Abington Town Hall for our Second Annual Touch-a-Truck event. Trucks and vehicles of all sizes and shapes will be on display for children to explore. SSCPS will also have its very own Veggie Van on display. Everyone from SSCPS who attended last year had a great time and, more importantly, there were many families from the area not connected to our school who turned out for this most enjoyable activity. This is a great fundraiser and introduces our school to parents in the area. Spread the word to your neighbors and friends – this is a fun and inexpensive way to spend a Sunday.

#### K-6 PRINCIPAL REPORT

Wonderful things are going on all around the school as children have culminating performances and celebration of their project work. To give you a sense of what an example of this work is, I would like to describe a performance. A little over a week ago I was fortunate enough to see the Kindergarteners from Kassandra Grant and Judy Pritchard's Pod rehearse and then put on a production of a "Carnival of the Animals." The children moved in time with the music and their own personality, and they also effectively depicted the animals. The mules looked like mules, and the swans, looked like swans. It was a beautiful thing to see. The children were so comfortable with the whole process, with being a child and expressing themselves. The performances were joyous and the rehearsals were joyous too. In the rehearsals, Kassandra would direct the children, watch the children and ask the children how they should move. She understood the children's movements so deeply and together they constructed the choreography. All I could think was "Wow, I love this. This is what we are all about."

This kind of work is why we exist as a school. To give both teachers and students the opportunity to not only learn and study art, literature, music, science, history and math but to construct their own work of which we can all be proud. I know I learned from watching the Kindergarteners. I learned about movement and the development of large motor movements. In fact Carol Wise, who is our occupational therapist, talked with me afterwards about all of the elements of the performance and why they were good for the children.

The Carnival of the Animals was more than a performance of a skilled staff and a disciplined group of students, it was a wonderful example of the collaboration between, inspired teachers, families and students. It was the three legged stool that is a model of what we aspire to be. Not only did every family come in to watch but many of the adults had helped with the rehearsals, costumes and most significantly all had sent us cooperative children. The dance was a thirty minute long performance where often 18 kindergarteners were back stage. I only heard them once during the entire show, another case of "Wow." In our fourteen years we have been trying to develop a school that is a happy place. Kassandra's Kindergarteners are one of many examples that brought us closer to that mission. I know this kind of effort goes on every day. Right now I am reminded of this work as I see Elise's students carry their own car seats for a trip to work and

study at Holly Hill Farm. Thanks to families, teachers and students for working to make joyous education a reality.

Conservation Project is still looking for perennial plants to put in a new garden in the front of the school near the sign. This garden will not only beautify our school but it is a Memorial Garden to honor our students.

#### AMENDMENT TO THE SSCPS BY-LAWS

The amendment recommended by the Governance Committee and approved by the Board of Trustee at their meeting on April 16, 2009, clarifies the wording of the Article dealing with Trustees' terms. The following is presented for affirmation.

#### Article V 3-a "Terms"

#### **Current Wording**

**VOTE FOR ONE (1) OF THE FOLLOWING:** 

The Terms of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive, staggered three-year terms. Exceptions may be granted by the Board.

#### To be replaced by the following wording

"The terms of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive three (3) year terms for a maximum of nine (9) consecutive years. Shorter terms (1 or 2 years) may be served at the discretion of the Board."


