#### **HEALTH OFFICE**

Lynn Bethal from the Dept of Oral Health will be here in the a.m.on May 21<sup>st</sup> to screen the students who signed up for the free dental program. Please remind all students to stay away from the wooded areas on the playground. There have been several staff and students who have reported tic bites. Also students should use bug repellant on any field trips that involve wooded areas. This should be applied at home.

#### 7-12 PRINCIPAL REPORT

Last year at this time there were discussions in Level IV and the High School to install a bell system in order to help adults and students make the more than one dozen transitions in a typical school day more timely and efficient. The discussion continues into this year as we struggle with managing our time. In an informal study last week we noted that between four to seven minutes are lost per period while students file into classes. Multiplied out over the course of a school year, we are losing twelve to fourteen hours of class instruction in math, English, history, science, Spanish, and project/workshop. In a country struggling to add hours to the school day and days to the school year in order to prepare our students for the global competition they will enter when they graduate from high school, this does not bode well for us. Also disturbing is the poor habits in punctuality that our students are developing. It is difficult to hold students accountable when there are no structures in place to announce the end and beginning of periods. The plan to add bells last year was halted for financial reasons. Currently, we are exploring low cost alternatives that would provide the structure educators are asking for in order to make the best use of the limited time we have to teach students and in the process help our students to develop good habits. The administration and staff welcomes your feedback on this proposed change. Please contact me if you have any questions, concerns, or ideas about the implementation of a bell system next year for Level IV and the high school.

#### AMENDMENT TO THE SSCPS BY-LAWS

The amendment recommended by the Governance Committee and approved by the Board of Trustee at their meeting on April 16, 2009, clarifies the wording of the Article dealing with Trustees' terms. The following is presented for affirmation.

#### Article V 3-a "Terms"

#### **Current Wording**

**VOTE FOR ONE (1) OF THE FOLLOWING:** 

The Terms of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive, staggered three-year terms. Exceptions may be granted by the Board.

#### To be replaced by the following wording

"The terms of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be a maximum of three (3) consecutive three (3) year terms for a maximum of nine (9) consecutive years. Shorter terms (1 or 2 years) may be served at the discretion of the Board."
